# SUNDAY - January 10, 2021 Baptism of the Lord

Today we mark the transition from the celebration of Christmas into the work that Jesus has come to do. While the Christmas readings have provided us with stories of Jesus' revelation to the shepherds, the magi, and prophets in the temple in Jerusalem, the focus was always on Jesus' private life. Today, he leaves that private, hidden life behind and seeks out John. Something new is about to happen in the history of the world and it all began with his baptism by John in the Jordan.

My dear friends, when we read the story of the baptism of Jesus in Mark's Gospel, we almost get the impression that Mark wants to say: "Now the show, the real thing with Jesus of Nazareth can get underway." When Jesus is baptized in the river Jordan, he is set on the path of service, of love, of simplicity. It is also at that moment that Jesus receives his true name: God's Son, God's beloved.

Out of that baptism and out of his being claimed by God as his beloved Son, Jesus will go to all people, all through the pages and stories of the Gospel; he will look at people with God's goodness in his eyes; he will cure them with God's power in his hands; he will liberate them with God's love in his heart; he will forgive them with God's mercy in his words.

The point is that out of his being baptized and out of his being claimed by God as his beloved Son, Jesus will give totally of himself until that baptism is entirely accomplished, and that is at his death on the cross. For it is on the cross that the baptism has fully matured, has come full circle. There is where God's goodness, God's power, God's message, and God's mercy, as embodied in Jesus, reach their climax.

The significance of being baptized only begins to dawn on us during the course of the years. Our being baptized only becomes something fascinating when we let ourselves be fascinated by Jesus; when we try to look at people with Jesus' goodness; when we are prepared to forgive them with his mercy; when we try to liberate them with his message, when we try to love them with his love.

Our being baptized really becomes significant when we make room for Jesus in our lives, so that he may become visible to others in our eyes, in our hearts, in our words, in our hands. In other words, our being baptized is not something of the past, but becomes something very much of the present, when slowly lesus comes to life and to resurrection in our lives.

When we celebrate Christ's baptism today, then I do not think that we can get around celebrating our baptism as well. And if it is true that in the Gospels, in story after story, on page after page, we find what being baptized meant for Jesus, then we too may find there what our being baptized can mean for us.

So, we go on our way: all of us baptized in Jesus' name and others who long for it: men and women, young and old, boys and girls. We go on our way, full of enthusiasm, but also with a good amount of hesitation, supporting each other, praying that Jesus may be in us, his disciples.
