### SUNDAY January 13, 2019 Baptism of the Lord

Reflections from the Gospel Gals

We celebrate the Baptism of Jesus on the first Sunday following the Epiphany and all of the readings today reflect Jesus' Baptism. The Baptism of Jesus by John the Baptist is a theological event, which modern theologians also view as an historical event based on certain facts in the life of the adult Jesus. He is 30 years old and with His life intertwined with that of John the Baptist, he is baptized by John in the Jordan River. We wonder why,—Jesus, who is without sin, is being baptized. Baptism, a ritual of the times, was an act of repentance. Jesus, born in the likeness of man, known as the son of Mary, went into the waters of baptism representing the closing of his private life and the beginning, and acceptance by Jesus, of His public ministry of redemption.

We are celebrating a New Year, a new beginning, and this enormously significant mystery of John baptizing and affirming Jesus as the Messiah of the whole world is exciting. Through many readings, commentaries and discussions with the Gospel Gals, I am humbled by the depth of thought on this wonderful gospel. I would like to show some of the parallels between Jesus' baptism and-our very own baptism. Our Baptism reflects Christ's baptism. Firstly, at Christ's baptism the Holy Spirit descended upon Him, and at our baptism the Holy Trinity entered our soul. Secondly, at Christ's Baptism He was proclaimed, 'Beloved Son of God' and at our baptism we became adopted sons/daughters of God. Thirdly, at Christ's baptism the heavens were opened, and at our baptism heaven was opened to us. Fourthly, at His baptism Jesus prayed, and at our baptism we are prayed for that we might avoid actual sin. Thus, both baptisms have the presence of cleansing water, God proclaiming His unending love for all His children, the presence of the Holy Trinity and the faith filled community gathering to bear witness.

With His baptism, Jesus was revealed as the Son of God, in the likeness of man in all things except sin. The Holy Spirit anointed Jesus not just for teaching, but for redeeming. Jesus connected with man and identified with human experiences. Baptism was the start of the public spiritual journey for Jesus and our baptism began our spiritual journey.

The purpose of the gospel is Truth ... and the voice of God came from heaven saying, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased'. Central to this gospel message is what we all need to know. Asking ourselves the question, "Who am I?" reveals exactly what we need to know. We need to know ... we are a beloved child of God for all eternity. We need to know ... we are inherently good. We need to know ... we are inherently important.

God our Saviour, according to his mercy, through water and rebirth and renewal of the Holy Spirit, has poured on us richly, through Jesus Christ, many graces on our journey to eternal life. The Baptism of Jesus displayed a beautiful picture of the Triune God amongst the earliest followers of Jesus and it does for us today.
