SUNDAY - January 17, 2021 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time The basic motive of today's readings is our being called by God. There are all kinds of calls going on

in the readings today—and all kinds of people who respond in different ways. Sometimes people are being called clearly, sometimes not-so-clearly. The beauty of the readings is that such a call happens in very ordinary ways. In the case of Samuel, for instance, we may be taken aback by the fact that the circumstances of his call were not extraordinary. It happened while Samuel was half-awake. Some of us may be disappointed by the ordinariness of the event. We would much prefer to see God's call take place as an esoteric event amid streaks of lightening and peals of thunder. Then at least it would be certain. But God is always full of surprises!

In a great variety of ways, God calls us in Jesus who whispers to each one of us: "Follow me". He does not force us; he does not twist our arm; he calls us gently, but persistently, not just once, but always. This calling is embedded in the very ordinary day to day events, in human encounters, in suffering, in the challenges of life, in the needs of others. It presupposes that we tune into God calling us. We need to be attentive and give ourselves some precious moments of quiet to reflect on what goes on in us and in the world around us. It presupposes that we pay attention to the persons and events that make up our lives.

This listening to God's calling us is described in the Scriptures as following Jesus. It is really staying with Jesus, an abiding with Jesus, and giving ourselves over to Jesus whom we profess as our Lord, as the Messiah. Today's Gospel reminds us that a gracious God hears us, and we are invited to allow God's voice to shatter our plans of what we think we know to be true.

Parker Palmer writes: "Vocation doesn't come from willfulness. It comes from listening. I must listen to my life and try to understand what it is truly about . . . or my life will never represent anything real in the world, no matter how earnest my expectations..." Do we hear the voice of God speaking in our lives as clearly as Samuel did? If we do not, then maybe we need to sleep closer to the ark, so to speak. Maybe we need to put ourselves in a more advantageous position for hearing God's voice. Do we make time for stillness in our lives: rest, retreat, reflection, and meditation? Do we sit before the Blessed Sacrament in tranquil moments and silence the restless flow of anxieties and preoccupations? Do we sit before the mystery of our own lives—our relationships, our work, our story—and allow God to speak to us by name through what is most meaningful and personal to us? If we do not come and see, we cannot say we have not been asked. God calls us today.

We must also be prepared to let ourselves be won over by God's grace, for it is God's pledge that with his power at work in us, we can perform deeds that we never thought ourselves capable of. It is all part of the fact that in God's eyes we are, despite our weakness and insignificance, the stuff of which God's kingdom is built. We have all it takes to build the city of God.
