# SUNDAY January 19, 2020 Second Sunday of Ordinary Time

We have six weeks of "ordinary time" before the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, February 26th. This is the time in the church's calendar that orients us -- "orders" us--to our mission. Diocesan bishops are called "Ordinaries." It is an apt description of their task: to order the people of God for our common work. It is also a fitting theme as we celebrate this Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. We, brothers and sisters in Christ have a common mission. We too are ordered and called to a common task. What is that task?



The identity of Jesus (who he was and how people saw him) and his mission (what was it he claimed to profess) takes center stage in John's Gospel. John emerges from the desert to remind us that nothing is more important than living

our lives as a testimony to God. In this week's Gospel, John the Baptist identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world.

What then is the issue in that so familiar line: "Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world?" I would suggest that this is an impossible combination, an utter contradiction. What, do you suppose, can a lamb do in the face of evil in the world? In no way is that an adequate match. A lamb, of all things, that gentle innocent animal that we want to hug; it is not prepared nor is it capable of violent resistance, and even less of attack. Over and against the lamb stands the sin of the world.

John the Baptist and the entire Christian tradition after him have insisted on identifying Jesus as the Lamb that takes away the sin of the world. By identifying Jesus in these terms, we give a most unlikely character sketch of him. But it is a character sketch of Jesus his own conduct forces on us. These terms sum up the entire life project of Jesus, and leave us, who are baptized in his name, with quite a program. Jesus broke that chain of violence; he put an end to the law that you must get even. Jesus indeed takes away the sins of the world, when with him and in his power, we refuse to get even and to strike back; even with him, we snap out of the vicious circle of self-interest, of revenge, and retaliation.

The line, "The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" may sound at times like a pious platitude that won't set anybody on fire. But if we look a little closer, it becomes in fact a statement of hope, a statement of protest, a statement of defiance, inspired and born by Jesus, the Lamb of God.

The mission of Jesus is also our mission. We cannot be good disciples of Jesus if we are not also good apostles. To be a good Christian necessarily entails being a good evangelizer. Our responsibility is not only to save our own souls and "go to heaven". Our call is also to share our faith with others, help them to know Jesus and his Gospel, and to experience directly the love of God.
