Reflections from the Gospel Gals

January 20, 2019 World day of Migrant and Refugees

In today's gospel, divine love permeates our human faith story in the scenes of Jesus' first miracle. The gospel begins with a vivid account of intercessory prayer. Mary and Jesus and his disciples are attending a wedding. Mary, likely one of only a handful of guests, sees the married couple in their vulnerability and need and she responds. Many of us readily see obvious individual or grand scale needs, but few of us are attentive to subtle needs or pain hidden by an exterior mask of 'all is well'. Mary, Mother of God, our mother, sees pain and she inclines herself to those in need; she interceded on behalf of the married couple. She did not tell Jesus how to answer her prayer, nor did she try to influence God's plan. She knew God hears all prayer and she simply prayed, "They have no wine." Still today, Mary is our great intercessor! What more comfort could we ask for than to know that Mary, Queen and Mother-of all, sees us in our needs, inclines herself to us and prays to God on our behalf. We in turn join our prayers with Mary and with the entire community of saints to intercede, to pray without ceasing.

And Jesus answered, "What concern is that to you and to me?" Jesus' answer is not so much a question as it is a call to reflection. The long and short of it is that the needs of others are our concern, our business and our responsibility to act. Often we hear people say, and sadly we sometimes say, 'that is not my business, it's their own fault, it's someone else's turn to help? None of these answers wash. We are to do God's work for those in need using all of our God-given gifts, resources and blessings. Our work as followers and imitators of Jesus is finished only when we pass through the proverbial Pearly Gates of Eternity and hear God say to us, "Welcome home, good and faithful servant"

Jesus took action. He looked with love upon the couple; he provided for their lack and he gave them dignity and respect in their community. Not only that, but in his action, Jesus taught us that rituals are to become instead reservoirs of the limitless, everlasting love and mercy and compassion that he has for all of us. Filled to the brim with finest wine, as the jars used for ritual purification were, Jesus is telling us 'I love you to overflowing'! And, by his action Jesus revealed his glory, not to the chief steward or the married couple, but to his disciples and 'those who served'. He continually seeks after us to reveal himself, perfect love, to us. Jesus is the new wine of salvation love and new life. He binds us to himself in love in our lives, every day, at times when we believe we have things together and are in control and at times when we are in the depths of darkness.

This particular gospel, on this World Day of Migrants and Refugees, gives us a chance to reflect upon a Jesus action taken by our community. Our Church family along with help from others worked to relieve pain and suffering and we offered new hope, dignity and opportunity for a new life to a refugee family. We used our God-given gifts, followed Jesus' way of love and extended God's love to a family in need. We declared God's glory! Together we all did it! Think about it!
