Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - January 28, 2024Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday, January 28th, is the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, and the Gospel according to Mark tells of an amazing happening on the Sabbath in the synagogue in Capernaum. Jesus, no longer a child but an adult, entered the synagogue and taught. His listeners were captivated. They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority. The Gospel went on to describe the presence of a man overcome by an unclean spirit. To everyone's surprise, this spirit also recognized the authority of Jesus and came out of the man. What was the source of this compelling authority that emanated from Jesus?

Chapter one of Mark's Gospel suggests a possible answer. Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. (1:35) Jesus spent time with his Father. He heard and listened to God's voice. He became one with truth, with love and with mercy. This was the source of his authority. This was the source of his understanding and knowledge.

At this time in our history, the search for truth is threatened. "False news" was not a familiar concept a few years ago but now it is part of our world. Recently, Pope Francis expressed concern for this phenomenon and encouraged all people to seek and find truth. Some people use lies, misinformation, and fraud to manipulate, to gain power, and sell goods and destructive ideas. They are most definitely not concerned with the common good. In contrast Jesus was and is very much concerned with the common good. Jesus desires everyone to be at peace, to be filled with joy and compassion. In John's Gospel Jesus told his disciples: You shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free. (8:32) The authority of Jesus comes from caring for his listeners, from his desire to set all people free from fear and division. Jesus shares the truth that will bring comfort and peace to all people.

We too can hear God's voice amid all the loud and distracting noises besieging us. O that today you would listen to the voice of the Lord is the refrain of Psalm 95. We need to make space and time to hear God's voice, the source of truth and love. We need to go off to a solitary place and pray. In the letter to the Corinthians, St. Paul suggested that his readers not be distracted by getting married. He encouraged them to remain single so that they could devote themselves to God. Is God really asking us to refrain from getting married? No! Of course get married, of course have children, of course study, or pursue a career. But even in a deep and intimate relationship with another person, even when involved in caring for beloved children, even when working, growing, and living; leave room to hear God's voice, leave room to hear the voice of truth and love, leave room for the life-giving voice of authority.

Prayer Reflection

Word of the Week:

Benedictus

From Latin meaning "blessed," the hymn sung by Zechariah, John the Baptist's father, an elder priest, who became mute on learning that he and Elizabeth would become parents late in life. After John's birth, Zechariah's tongue is loosed and he praises God with this canticle beginning: "Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, for he has come to his people and set them free" (Luke 1:68). Since the early centuries, the Benedictus has been sung in the morning prayer of the church's liturgy because of its praise for the coming of the Redeemer and its allusion to Christ coming as the dawn to give light to those in darkness. The **Benedictus** is one of four canticles sung at the start of Luke's gospel, including Mary's Magnificat, (My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord), the song of the angels to the shepherds (Glory to God in the highest!), and Simeon's prayer at the presentation of Jesus in the temple (Lord, now you let your servant go in peace). Together these songs remind us that, in the face of good news, the most reasonable response is to sing. Joyful people know this. Saint Augustine, who said many things well, insisted: "Singing is for one who loves." From The General Instruction on the Liturgy of the Hours: The Gospel canticles, the *Benedictus*, the Magnificat and the Nunc dimittis, should be accorded the same solemnity and dignity as is usual for the hearing of the Gospel (138).

- I) Registration is now open for the online course "Integral Ecology: From Laudato si' to Laudate Deum". Offered by the Pontifical Universities and Atheneums of Rome, the course is led by a renowned faculty of academics, leaders, and activists from around the world, representing some of the major institutions and groups involved in the area of creation care. The course runs until June, and consists of six 90 minutes modules, a workshop in March, and an online conference in May. The first module will be released on January 25, but people can join the course any time before March 31. The course fee is 30 Euros (approximately \$45 CAD). - 5) The CCCB Episcopal Commission for Justice and Peace has today released its Pastoral Letter on the use of social media titled: "Let Your Speech Always Be Gracious." The release is timed with the liturgical memorial of Saint Francis de Sales, who was known for his graciousness in speech and who is invoked as a patron saint of writers and publishers. Acknowledging the prominent role social media has come to play at an individual and societal level, this timely Pastoral Letter considers the benefits and dangers of social media from the perspective of Catholic Social Teaching. It provides tools for moral reflection and self-examination, and suggests seven commitments by which to be guided for a more ethical use of social media.
