

Today, January 29th, is the 4th Sunday in Ordinary time and the Gospel of Matthew is the familiar and thought-provoking passage in which Jesus gives us the gift of the Beatitudes. For many of us the Beatitudes join the Parables of the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son as familiar Gospel passages that show us how to live a life of meaning and love. In all three of these powerful passages Jesus gives us unexpected recommendations on how to be and relate to our world. The Father embraces and forgives the Prodigal Son, the Samaritan shows compassion to a stranger and in the Beatitudes, Jesus promotes meekness, peace and being merciful. This is not about how to live a life in which you experience the kingdom of God and contribute to justice and peace. This is about seeing God.

We might get the idea from the Beatitudes that they are encouraging us to persevere during challenging times because we will be rewarded in heaven in the future. *Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven.* We get the impression that it is in the future that we will be comforted, that we will inherit the earth, that we will receive mercy. *Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.* That is surely part of the message. However, Jesus also said, *The Kingdom of God is within you* (Luke 17:21) and on another occasion, *The Kingdom of God is at hand* (Mark 1:15). These words indicate that the Beatitudes are not just about the future but also about the present.

The Beatitudes are a promise that God is with us every moment of every day, blessing us. We are blessed because we are not alone when we strive for justice and peace. We are not alone when we are persecuted because we are trying to do the right and loving thing. We are not alone when we mourn. God is with us and within us. It is God that gives us the strength and wisdom to be merciful, to be poor in spirit, to be meek and nurture a pure heart. It is God's presence that brings us comfort, fills our hearts and showers us with mercy. As we embrace God's presence and blessings, we live in the kingdom of God. Thus, we are fortunate to see God in our brothers and sisters, in nature and in our own hearts. The

Beatitudes are undoubtedly about the future, but just as importantly, they are also about the present. We live in the present and that is one of the spaces where we meet God.

Predictably, the capacity of his living room was reached and after weeks of searching a suitable spot, we settled on the Scout Hall on Tyndall where the first Mass was attended by 47 people and Fr. Jackson wore his Missionary Vestments . . . the rent for the Hall was \$15.00 per week !"

Library Corner

January 28th celebrates the Feast Day of the 13th century Dominican friar, St Thomas Aquinas, whose moral and theological thought underlay the "Natural Law", the foundation of Catholic belief. We have three copies of his biography by G K Chesterton. Chesterton is brilliant, but not an easy read and It may be better to skip his lengthy introductory chapter and proceed directly to the edifying and varied life of this international medieval scholar. It is Thomas who gave us the cautionary reminder that "it is a sin to withhold a compliment". Earlier in the month on the 17th is the Feast Day of St Anthony, "the patron saint of lost things" --- wise to keep on the best side of him these whitehaired days.
