SUNDAY January 5, 2020 The Epiphany Of The Lord

What in the world is going on? It's one that today's Gospel could raise for us. Everything about the birth of Jesus is surprising, unexpected, turning expectations on their heads. The device that Matthew uses is the story about a few wise men coming from the East, who inquire about Jesus. The issue for Matthew is that people, of whom you never would have expected it, are inquiring about Jesus. They are open and receptive to him. Of all people, this time it is the pagans who are prepared to acknowledge Jesus for who he is. They are really open for what Jesus has to offer.



The story of how the wise men from the East recognize Jesus for who

he really is full of irony. There are other actors in the story that we too easily overlook. These other actors are King Herod and the religious leaders in Jerusalem. They are the total opposite of the wise men. The men from the East, like the shepherds, are supposed to be ignorant in religious matters. They are the last ones you would consult when it comes to things about God. The scribes and the chief priests, on the other hand, are the religious experts. They know all there is to know about God. They know from the Scriptures where Jesus is to be born, so they have no difficulty telling pagans where Jesus can be found. But then they stall. They remain at a safe distance from him. In fact, they begin to plot against him, and devise ways to get rid of him, because he upsets their little game and exposes their hunger for power.

We see a child, but our hearts are open and attentive enough to acknowledge the King we are looking for. It is in the ordinary day to day life unfolding where meaning and majesty awaits us. It is words spoken, gestures received, and actions taken that makes us the magi of today. What star will you follow this year? Epiphany invites us to consider how ready we are to take that journey of faith and be surprised by joy as C.S. Lewis so eloquently said. Another wise man Basil the Great in the early church said: words guide us still... stars cross the sky...wise men journey from pagan lands; earth receives its savior in a cave. Let there be no one without a gift to offer, no one without gratitude as we celebrate the salvation of the world, the birthday of the human race! What in the world is going on? Jesus is in the world going on and on. Now that is an epiphany comfort, is it not? Jesus is in the world going on and on. The way Matthew puts the story together makes it of lasting significance to us. Are we prepared, like the shepherds and the wise men from the East, to leave the familiar and set out in search of God, in whatever unfamiliar and even unsettling ways he may make himself known to us? Are we prepared to let him change our lives?
