SUNDAY - July 11, 2021 Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The disciples get their training wheels off in today's gospel. They go out, two by two, no food, no sack, no money, no extra clothes. Six little pairs of newly minted ministers, expected to exorcise demons, cure the sick, and proclaim the gospel. Just like Jesus. Did they crash? The gospel does not report any trouble. What it does say is that the six pairs of disciples did just what they were told: driving out demons, healing the sick, and preaching repentance. If people did not like their message, they were instructed to shake the dust of that place from their sandals and leave. What fascinates us now is how smoothly Jesus handed off his authority to his disciples and how readily they picked it up and exercised it. If only it were that simple today, we might think. If only the authority of Jesus were available to the church now.

Jesus' empowering and "sending" of the apostles to extend his mission of healing reflects the missionary strategy of the Early Church: travel light and keep moving, do what is good, and put your trust completely in God. I THINK that is a good approach for Christians of any time and place. Life is a journey, a pilgrimage to holiness and at times it will get messy. I know our expectations of what that means to be a missionary do not always match God's Plan! Amos thought he was going to be a simple shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. He wound up being a prophet. The Twelve in the Gospel probably thought they were going to watch Jesus preach and cure the sick for many years to come. They wound up being sent out two by two, with absolutely nothing physical to sustain them, to drive out demons and cure the sick themselves.

If we look closely at the picture of the disciples given in Mark's gospel, we can well wonder how on earth Jesus had the courage to send them out on mission. He called men whose hands were not clean; men who were broken and they knew it so well. Yet, they allowed themselves to be won over by God's grace, converted if you wish. Standing in the face of the Holy God, they know themselves unholy, but they know themselves transformed by God. Aware of their failures and sinfulness, they also know themselves, in the power of God, to be capable of going beyond their own abilities. In the call of the disciples Jesus wanted them to be "unencumbered." They were to be apostles of healing and forgiveness. Jesus is asking them to trust only his grace and loving involvement in their lives. It takes a strong stretch of imagination to step into the shoes of those disciples, are you up to it? The message the Twelve preached is the same one that Jesus preached as he began his ministry—repentance. A saying goes: "There are many things a person can do alone, but being a Christian is not one of them." Jesus knew that of course, which is why he sent out his disciples two-by-two.

If this week's readings have a theme, it might be: "Everything starts with God." Each of us, according to today's second reading from the letter to the Ephesians, has been" blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before him in love." We have been given a formidable inheritance as God's adopted children, beginning with the guidance of the Holy Spirit. But may I add; the work of God is not a solitary affair. We have also been given a mission.

PROVINCIAL HEALTH ORDERS UPDATE

As of July 1, 2021, restrictions are lifted on faith based gatherings. As per the latest Provincial Health Orders, we are now able to resume in-person services with no restrictions in terms of number of attendees. Please note we are encouraged to bow instead of shaking hands, and no drinking from the cup for the time being. Please see Bishops Gary's message on restart plan step 3 which is on our website and posted in foyer. Face masks are optional but recommended for all people 12 and over who are not yet fully vaccinated (that is, 2 weeks post their second vaccination). Details around facial covering recommendations are in restart plan.

SCAM ALERT

There is a scam going around using the Bishop of Victoria's name, BUT there has also been a resurgence of the scam involving Fr. William's name, which has gone around in the past. If you get a text message or an email from "Fr. William" asking for a "favor" which usually leads to gift cards and/or cash please IGNORE this message. Often the initial message is an invitation to call or email him back. IGNORE that also. Fr. William has never, will never and would never contact parishioners with this kind of request. If you get an email, look carefully at the email address, and report all suspicious emails and texts to the office. Stay vigilant!


