#### Reflections from the Gospel Gals

What a moving image we are to contemplate in today's Gospel. Jairus falls at Jesus' feet and begs him repeatedly to come and lay his hands on his daughter who is at the point of death. Jesus goes, but upon arriving is told that the young girl has died. Jesus' response - "Do not fear, only believe." In the midst of a cynical crowd Jesus leads the child's father and mother to where the child is, takes her by the hand and heals her.

We are also immersed in the scene of the actions of the woman with the haemorrhage. She believed with all her heart that if she could only touch Jesus' cloak she would be made well. And so she was. But Jesus was aware of the power gone from him and asked who amongst the crowd had touched him. The woman, in fear and trembling, approached in truth to confess that it was she. Why fear? She was 'unclean' and should not have been touching anyone, as they would then be considered ritually unclean. She, herself, for twelve long years had been seeking a cure, and during that time would have been ostracized from her community.

Did Jesus care about the cynicism of the crowds or the 'inappropriate' action of the woman? Not at all! In both instances, he encourages and heals. To Jairus he says "do not fear, only believe." And to the woman, "...your faith has made you well; go in peace."

The desperation of both Jairus and the woman is palpable. Each of us has experienced situations where we have approached Jesus in our own desperation. Maybe we've begged, bargained, pleaded or cried out for help. Maybe we've wished for the healing touch of Jesus here and now.

Jesus is present here and now in the Spirit dwelling within each of us. When we take the time to be present to the other, to acknowledge the Spirit within the other, to respond with encouragement, with mercy, with kindness - Jesus is present. We are his only hands on this earth. The impact of 'taking the time' provides Grace for both the one and the other.

Jesus' amazing touch is also available to us through the Sacraments, Jesus' gifts provided to sustain us. Fr. Roger J. Landry in his writing on this week's Gospel asks whether we humbly reach out to touch Jesus with the faith of Jairus and the woman, or are we like the crowd, just 'bumping into Jesus', not receiving his healing and transformative power. This is an important question and one that should give us pause for reflection. Whether we are partaking in the Eucharist (**the** opportunity to reach out and touch Jesus) or receiving healing in Reconciliation or the Anointing of the Sick, if we approach with humble Faith participating with our whole heart, we will obtain the immeasurable Grace that Jesus wants for each of us just as he gave it to Jairus and the woman.

We can be Jesus to others through the gift of the Holy Spirit and we have the opportunity to really encounter Jesus through the gifts that are the Sacraments. This is the healing of Jesus here and now.

Lord, help me to reach out to you with courage and with my entire being, in my need and for the needs of others.
