Reflections from the Gospel Gals

In today's gospel Mark gives us three short verses that strongly emphasizes Christ's human understanding for man. First, the apostles have returned from their mission, next Jesus shows compassion to them and lastly, Jesus shows compassion to the crowds. The apostles have returned after their first mission. With only the clothes on their backs each pair of men had done the good works of evangelization; teaching, healing and casting out demons. Now, we can picture them gathered around Jesus sharing their experiences. Dusty and hungry, as they had no time even to eat, and they most certainly were very tired. Like us, their journey would present troubles as well as bursts of joy. Jesus said they need rest.

As I absorbed the gospel, in these very warm days of summer, I pictured Jesus and the disciples at this time. It was easy to feel the dust of the roads and then enjoy the Sea of Galilee. I would like to focus on Jesus and his apostles.

As Jesus compassionately took the twelve out in a boat, it was to attain 'quiet rest'. The daily struggle to respond to God's call had given the apostles no leisure. A calm reflection would bring a more complete understanding of their daily experiences, the Father working through them, and maybe some much need sleep.

Meditation comes to mind as it brings benefits to our busy lives. A blessing of inner calm can have one of many themes; I chose SILENCE. I would like to share Sr. Wendy's Book of Meditations, on 'Cleansing' which features the theme of 'silence'.

"Entering into silence is like stepping into cool clear water. The dust and debris are quietly washed away, and we are purified of our triviality. This cleansing takes place whether we are conscious of it or not: the very choice of silence, of desiring to be still, washes away the day's grime. ...a happy image of the mystery to which we surrender ourselves when we accept the balm of silence. The function of silence is to beautify and simplify. We have only to be still and let the waters of Grace refresh us".

Briefly, here are some of the other themes of meditation that may help us focus. PEACE rests on the decision to always struggle towards goodness and depends on a humble desire to do so. LOVE is essentially active and intent upon the needs of others. PRAYER can draw us into the loving heart of God. JOY comes in bursts that uniquely illuminate the heart and soul. As Father Karam says, "Happiness is manmade, Joy is a gift from God." TRUST was a huge theme for the apostles. The whole world is there for loving, but we must venture outside ourselves to discover it.

We have been shown the gigantic act of TRUST by the apostles who went ahead on absolute belief. These twelve gave obedience to Christ's word thus giving affirmation of his Devine Authority (Oneness with the Father).

As Jesus gave great comfort to his disciples we too know he will never abandon us. His perfect love will surround us and comfort us.

.....come follow Me and I will give you rest.
