SUNDAY - July 28, 2024 Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday, July 28th, is the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time. In John's Gospel we hear the well-known account of the feeding of the five thousand. This story is so familiar to us, we might be tempted to not give it much attention. But this event made such an impact on the people of Jesus' time that it is described in all four gospels. According to James Martin, SJ, the only other miracle narrative described in all four gospels is the Resurrection. "That provides a gauge for how dramatic, memorable, and important the event was for the disciples and the early church." (James Martin, *Jesus*).

The people of Israel had a deep appreciation that God provided for them throughout their history. In the first reading, Elisha, described as a man of God, ordered loaves of barley and fresh ears of grain to be given to a group of one hundred people. They ate until satisfied and had some left, according to the word of the Lord. In today's Psalm 145, the Lord is praised and thanked for providing for his people. You open your hand to feed us, Lord; you satisfy all our needs. In John's Gospel, Jesus saw the large crowd coming toward him and he knew what he was going to do. He was going to fulfill God's word and provide nourishment for all. Jesus knew that the people were tired and hungry, and he understood that he could help them. Furthermore, this amazing happening alerted the crowd to pay attention, to recognize that Jesus was the source of something more than bread, that he was the source of something they did not even realize they needed. A few verses after the miraculous feeding of the multitude was described in John's gospel, Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. And as he had declared, Jesus offered his body and blood at the Last Supper. Jesus continues this act of love to this day – we are so loved and valued that Jesus gives himself to us again and again and we are transformed.

What about the boy with the loaves and fish? What is his role in this astonishing event? Maybe the boy overheard the apostles talking about their concern – and with the innocence of a child, he offered his little bit of food. What are two fish and five loaves among so many people? But Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated. And there was plenty for everyone! We are

often caught in the perception that our little offering of money, food, encouragement, and example is too small compared to the overwhelming poverty of millions and the alarming damage caused to the environment. Let us trust like that little boy! Let us have faith that God will bless our small offerings and use them to nourish and heal our world. Our God is an Awesome God!

2024/25 Sacramental Preparation Programs for Children/Teenagers of St Patrick's and Holy Cross

Journey of Faith for Teenagers: Learn about the Catholic Faith, what it means to follow Jesus, and how to receive the graces needed to live the Way, the Truth and the Life. This program is designed for teenagers to venture on a faith journey and enter new life in right relationship with God. Students may prepare to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Communion and Reconciliation, as appropriate. ALL STUDENTS AGED 13+ YEARS OLD ARE WELCOME. Each student must participate with a sponsor.

Journey of Faith for Children: Does your child want to learn more about the Catholic Faith? This program is designed for children to venture on a faith journey and enter new life in relationship with God. Candidates may prepare for the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Communion and Reconciliation, as appropriate. ALL SCHOOL-AGED CHILDREN AGED 9-12 YEARS OLD ARE WELCOME. Each student must participate with a parent.

Together in Jesus First Reconciliation for Grades 2 and 3: Children who are baptized are ready to prepare for First Reconciliation in the Year I group when they reach the minimum age of 7 years old. This program is suitable for children 7-9 years old. Lessons edify their imagination and sense of wonder through storytelling, interactive learning, and prayer rituals. Each student must participate with a parent.

Together in Jesus Confirmation and First Communion for Grades 3 and 4: Children who have received the sacrament of First Reconciliation are ready to prepare for Confirmation and First Communion in the Year 2 group. Candidates who were in the First Reconciliation Year I group at St Patrick's/Holy Cross are automatically registered into the Year 2 group. If your child is not registered and wishes to join this group, please contact the Sacramental Prep Coordinator - Michele Bristow <u>mbristow@rcdvictoria.org</u>.

Please attend one of the Parent Info Sessions to be held on **Saturday Sep 14 at 3pm or Sep 21 at 5:15pm (30 min) at Holy Cross**. The First Reconciliation session for baptized candidates begins on Oct 5. Preparation for Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion begins in January. This year all classes take place at Holy Cross Parish (4049 Gordon Head Rd) before or after the Saturday 4pm mass. Question of the Week

What does it mean to have faith?

When we put our faith in other people, it means we trust them to do as they say and to follow through on their promises. It doesn't mean we believe that they exist. Yet this minimalist definition of faith seems to be what's most often applied in the realm of religion. Contrast that with what happens if we extend the same faith in God that we offer to people. As Jesuit theologian Michael Cook describes it, we only surrender our trust to those with whom we have a shared history. Committing our faith to another person involves risk. We become vulnerable to betrayal, deceit, or disappointment. Who would take such a risk unless the one to whom we give our faith has proven worthy of it? This is precisely the kind of faith Abraham surrenders to the God who invites him to leave home and embark on a future that's unknown. God promises land and descendants. If Abraham hadn't believed God was good for it, he would never have left his father's tents.
