testament that his father would provide. He was sure of his father's hand.

Jesus knows our needs; he meets us in our needs and he has a plan. Often in the face of life's worries and struggles we rely on our own resources as we try to bring human solutions and to deal with a world seemingly 'gone crazy'.

Take today's gospel. Jesus and his disciples have gone to a quiet, beckoning mountainous region. It was in such settings that Jesus would teach his disciples or go to alone to pray. On this occasion, some 5,000 people have followed Jesus and his disciples because they have seen Jesus' miracles. It is Jesus who first notices the crowd and his heart is touched. He immediately knows their needs; he knows their spiritual hunger and he knows also their physical hunger.

When Jesus asks Philip how to feed the huge crowd, Philip sees the problem in human terms and answers as many of us would. I certainly would have been of Philip's way of thinking – 5,000 people to feed – no way – not even with the better part of a year's salary in your back pocket! Andrew says there's a boy there with "five barley loaves and two fish" which he is willing to share, but that won't go very far. The disciples see no answer save sending the people away to fend for themselves. Jesus, however, does not send anyone away, not ever, never. He feeds all who come to him and he transforms all, even the most meagre, into holiness. Jesus, in the community of his disciples, asks them to have the people sit down and they sit comfortably. We too can sit among the people and in profound silence behold the sacred, as we behold it at every Sunday Liturgy; - Jesus takes the bread in his hands, "when he had given thanks...." everyone ate as much as they wanted. They were fed at their deepest level and the Messiah was revealed though the people did not apprehend this; they saw only the miracle of bread and fish. The thanks that Jesus gave was his public

Again the question - What is Jesus saying to me; what does he want me to know or to do? Jesus wants me to trust him as he trusted his father, with expectation and without reservation. Jesus wants us to allow him to enter into our living, to walk with us, to transform us. He wants us to know that he is with us in our most unimaginable, impossible struggles. And, when, in life, we see only one set of footprints, he wants us to know that he is carrying us. We will be transformed. God's unfathomable peace will be in us "for into his hands we will commend our spirit and into his hands we will commend our soul". Yet, that is not the end. Jesus wants us to look outward, past our own needs and be with others, minister to them and carry them when they cannot walk.

This week, let each of us take the unbearable heaviness of our heart into our hands, and, as Jesus did with the bread, give thanks, pray with God to God from the depths of our hope and assurance. In peace walk with Jesus in the company of those he sends to accompany us. Then let us go to the one who needs our gentle touch, the warmth of our voice, the help of our actions, the openness of our heart and walk with that person; in doing so we may minister to angels.




