From Fr. William's Desk

"Whoever loves father and mother more than me is not worthy of me." Jesus seems to be making an attack on family life, telling us to turn our backs on our own flesh and blood. The consequences of leaving your family in Jesus' time were dire indeed. They are what lesus had in mind when he spoke of "taking up one's cross" and "losing one's life for my sake." Did he offer anything in exchange? Yes. He set up his own company of followers as a replacement

family, a new gathering of people linked by bonds of commitment to Jesus himself. lesus exhorts these new communities of disciples to practice hospitality toward each other and to make up for loss of family advantage.

Thus, the opening words of today's Gospel may be understood in two interlocking ways. First, Jesus is saying that no individual and no group of people can so live their lives as to put their own interests absolutely above those of others. The wants of any person or any group of people (e.g. a family) cannot be met by trampling on or denying the rights of others. Family exists for the good of the whole and we are meant to increase love not diminish it. The second meaning of Jesus' words follow logically from this. In the view of lesus, and it is a theme running right through the New Testament, all who identify with him, who become his followers, belong to a new family. It is a family where every single person, including family members, 5:00pm relatives, friend's as well as complete strangers but, most especially, those in need are truly my brother or sister.

lesus wished to spell the end of the divisions that bedevil the relations between human beings: divisions according to race, culture, nationality, religion, class, 9:00am employment and so on. What Jesus in substance is saying is that when we all work hard to ensure that everyone has enough, there will be more than enough for all. Jesus' concern then, is that others have all they need and my concern is that I have all $_{9:00am}$ that I need (not just what I want). Some questions: Am I living my life at the expense of others? Do I treat society as a place that owes me - and no one else - a living? Or 9:00am am I trying to live somehow in solidarity with others? Am I aware of neighbors or people in my area who are in real need? What does 'family' mean to me? Do I see the human family as being part of my family? What is my definition of family?
