From Fr. William's Desk

The gospel for the past three Sundays has come from Jesus' long discourse on the kingdom in the Gospel of Matthew. In these passages Christ has compared the kingdom to many things: a sower who went out to sow, a field sown with weeds as well as wheat, a mustard seed, yeast, and today a buried treasure, a pearl of great price, and a catch of fish.

Throughout the telling of these parables, the question arises of how to understand them? Jesus invites us to go on a quest for buried treasure in pursuit of a kingdom hidden from our eyes. We'll find it buried under the surface of things, lost in the marketplace, waiting to be found at the bottom of the sea of human experience usually in pain that is worthy of healing. It is not a journey for the faint of heart and it will take some doing to discover this kingdom and may cost everything in our possession to acquire it. To those who appreciate its value, nothing could be as important as this quest. To those who see with worldly eyes, unwilling to look deeper, this treasure may remain forever buried, right under their feet.

Those who dedicate themselves to this task will sacrifice decades of time, most of their resources, and all of their love to this labor. They will surrender personal goals for other-centered ones. They will feel at times that they have delivered themselves entirely into the service of their families and community. Like 8:30am the merchant seeking the best pearls, those who make the investment will come to 10:30am recognize the pearl of great price in community life. When you buy the field, the buried treasure comes with it? Who are the people in your live who dedicated themselves to this buried treasure?

What we do with the precious gifts of our time and our talents reveals what we truly value, whether it be wisdom, faith, and love--or our own comfort, ease, and amusement. Perhaps our desire for undiscovered treasure is prompted by the Holy Spirit: There really is treasure buried in the world! Jesus tells us there's a kingdom to be had out there, which is to say, in here. It's all around us awaiting 9:00am discovery and possession. Once possessed, however, the kingdom must also possess us. Then we will truly be rich.

EAT THIS BREAD DRINK THIS WINE

Why we do not allow intinction. Why we do not allow dipping the precious host in chalice. First of all, it is against liturgical norms. Also, when people dip the host they might possibly dip their fingers into the consecrated wine and transmit germs. When taking the host from the chalice to their mouth, there is the danger of the precious blood falling upon the floor or the moistened host breaking. Jesus invites us, as He invited his disciples, "to take and eat" and "to take and drink". Please talk to Fr. William if you have any questions.
