SUNDAY - July 30th, 2023Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday, July 30th, is the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Last Sunday we heard Matthew's Gospel in which Jesus compared the Kingdom of Heaven to a mustard seed and yeast and described it as containing both wheat and weeds. In today's Gospel, Jesus continues to teach on this topic as he shares three short accounts which express the value of the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus does not tell his listeners what the Kingdom of Heaven is, but states what the Kingdom of Heaven is like. It is like a treasure that is recognized as something exceptionally priceless.

As a child, Pierre Teilhard De Chardin (a Jesuit priest and paleontologist) searched for permanency among stones, rocks, and metals. Maturity and studies in science and theology led him to the understanding that the universe and all it contained was evolving and, therefore, changing. Teilhard recognized that the only permanent piece in the universe was God and God's love. The earth and all its contents were changing. In five billion years the earth will be swallowed by the sun, as the sun evolves into a red giant. Yet, we believe that all moments of love and the patterns of us beings, will exist for ever in the incomprehensible, loving embrace of God.

Does this imply that the Kingdom of Heaven is for the future? As with all things of God, the Kingdom of Heaven is a mystery, and we can only catch small glimpses. However, one aspect seems clear. If the Kingdom of Heaven is God, then it is always in existence, and we do not have to wait for the future to be part of it. This is what Jesus was telling the crowds and this is what he is telling us in Matthew's Gospel. Examine what you are spending your time and effort on, assess what you are accumulating. What things in your life do you pay attention to, do you worry about, do you value? The Kingdom of Heaven is not gold or pearls, it is not money or power. The Kingdom of Heaven is truly valuable because it is permanent, it will exist forever since love exists forever. Every loving gesture and kindness, every act of compassion and respect builds the Kingdom of Heaven and lasts forever.

Jesus wants us to recognize the Kingdom of Heaven, realize its value, and choose it. In every account that Jesus shared, the individual recognized the value of the treasure and gave up other materials to possess the prize. Not only are we asked to choose the Kingdom of Heaven, but we are called to help build it. Teilhard said: "Our duty, as men and women, is to proceed as if limits to our ability did not exist. We are collaborators in creation."

God has given us a remarkable invitation and responsibility. God created us to make a difference! So let us collaborate, let us be part of the evolution of the universe, let us build the Kingdom of Heaven.
