

In today's gospel, Jesus returns home and brings his disciples with him. He must have been so looking forward to seeing his family and friends, getting a break from the huge crowds that would gather to hear him teach.

But instead Jesus is "amazed" at the response he receives from those he is most familiar with.

One second, they are "astounded" at his teachings in the synagogue, his wisdom, the miracles they have heard about, and yet in the next breath they reject him. This rejection must have hurt Jesus deeply.

The folks of Jesus' hometown could not get past the fact that this man in front of them was just Mary's son, the carpenter. In their mind Jesus was just one of them. At this time, their hearts were not open to receiving Jesus, they did not believe, and they had no faith. This is why Jesus did not do any powerful miracles there.

Jesus' disciples were there with him through all of this. They saw how stubborn the people could be and how they had rejected Jesus. But, Jesus responds with compassion; he heals some of the sick people there and then continues to teach in the other villages. Showing his disciples and us that sharing the Word of God is not easy, but we must keep going.

Like Jesus, it's especially hard for us to share God's word with those we are closest to.

Two weeks ago, I was blessed to have all my family with me. My five small grandchildren took over my life. They spoke; I listened, really listened. The kind of listening that has you sitting on the floor, so you can be eye to eye with them. At bedtime we would pray together and then the questions would come. I treasured this time of getting to share Jesus with them. Their little hearts are so open.

And then there are the big people - my daughters, their husbands.

Why can I not talk to them about Jesus with the same joy I do when talking to the little ones. It may be because we both assume what the other is going to say: the 'been there, done that' kind of thing. There isn't much listening going on between us...and I wonder what my role is in that.

I believe that the people in our lives, our family, our friends are all gifts from God. In each one of them lives Jesus. Do we see Jesus in them, or are we so familiar with them and their story that we no longer really see them or truly listen to what they are saying?

If we, like the people of Nazareth, close our heart to those closest to us, then we deny God the opportunity to create miracles in our lives through those people he has blessed us with.

God's truth sometimes comes to us through people we least expect, the people who we are most familiar with.

This week let us listen to each other the way we listen to little ones. Let's come down to each others level so we can see into each others' eyes and find the Jesus within.

Let's amaze Jesus...this time with our open hearts, our belief, our faith, our awestruck wonder.

Let's welcome Jesus home.
