Reflections from the Gospel Gals

Last November, 5 women came together to read and discuss the upcoming Sunday Gospel readings. We have been meeting every Wednesday since and have become true sisters in Christ. Each week we reflect on the reading for that week and we try to see how the Gospel reflects in our lives. Father William has entrusted us to share our "Reflections from the Gospel Gals" while he is on Sabbatical.

And Jesus replied, "Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking at those who sat around him, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers! Whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

The scene of today's Gospel portrays the arrival of Mary, Jesus' mother, as well as his brothers. Rather than coming into the house where Jesus was staying, they all remained outside the house and called out to Him. The people around Jesus told Him that His family had arrived. However, rather than immediately going to find His family, Jesus says to His listeners: "Who is my mother or my brothers?" He goes on to say that any person who does the will of God becomes His brother, sister and mother.

Jesus says, we're not joined to each other by happenstance birth as a biological family. Rather, we find our identity and community in and through the relationship we share in God. When we receive Jesus Christ into our hearts by faith, we are born again into a spiritual family that will last forever. Jesus regarded his spiritual family as his true family and those who had believed in him were doing God's will.

Perhaps the question we need to ask ourselves is, are we doing the will of God? How do we know what the will of God is? Do we trust that whatever is going on in our lives is the will of God? We know that life is not easy. There are good times in our lives that bless us abundantly and there are painful and difficult times in our lives that may prompt us to question God or to wonder where God is. It is easy to sense God's presence and love when all is going well. But it is often difficult to experience God's presence when life is challenging. However, God's presence doesn't change; it is our perception that changes.

Our spiritual group has become better acquainted over the past few months. And in getting to know each other, we are also getting better acquainted with God. Sharing this hour weekly is helping each of us find a better understanding of what God's will is for each of us and how we can take it with us outside the walls of the Church when we say good bye.

We are all brothers and sisters in Christ. His Father is our Father. And every time we come to Church, we are coming home.
