Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - June 12th, 2022 Trinity Sunday

The great revelations of Christianity are not something that can be incorporated at first hearing. Take the doctrine of the Trinity, the foundational teaching upon which all other Christian understanding is composed. A properly catechized kindergartener can tell you that God is Threein-One but has no real idea what that means. The average adult in the pews can recite the same definition of Trinity but may further appreciate that this formula is more about our relationship to God than a static model of God's objective nature. As a theologically sophisticated person, you may link the idea of Trinity to the Incarnation of Jesus, to the authority of his teaching, as well as to his Resurrection. You may be able to speak of the ongoing, indwelling presence of God in the Spirit active every day in the world because we are. But even if you have a Ph.D. in systematic theology, whatever you say about the Trinity must include the dimension of mystery. Which means whatever you say or understand about the Trinity must be, at this time, incomplete.

In the fourth century a lot of people in the Christian world thought the priest Arius had a good take on the Trinity. He said that God came before his Word, so there was a time when Jesus was not. Some Christians even went around crooning: "There was a time when the Son was not." It became a top hit of the day. But then Saint Athanasius came along and said: "Those who maintain 'There was a time when the Son was not' rob God of his Word, like plunderers." Saint Augustine soon weighed in with his own take on the Trinity. Instead of a catchy tune, he told a love story. Love, he said, requires a lover, a beloved, and the action of love. Because love has these three parts, and God is the greatest love, then God must have three parts. But the last word on the Trinity goes to Saint Gregory of Nazianzus: "No sooner do I conceive of the one than I am illumined by the splendor of the three; no sooner do I distinguish them than I am carried back to the one."

The reason the Trinity is important is because it changes everything. If there is just a Deity out there who created the world, established some rules, and then sat back until Judgment Day, we are all in a heap of trouble. But if God so loves the world that Jesus entered into our skin and our predicament, showed us one clear path through sin and death, and promised to be with us always to the end of time, we have every reason to hope. We are not alone in this world, abandoned beneath our broken relationships, bad choices, and regrets. God is here, present, active, and powerful. If we want to listen to a voice of wisdom that will only tell us the truth about ourselves, the world, and the way through, that voice is talking to us right now. The truth is not always unbearable. Sometimes it is reason to dance, as wisdom demonstrates in Proverbs. God frontloaded creation with nothing but goodness, and though we have managed to pack a lot of evil into human history, that does not diminish the goodness still available. The Spirit of truth is prepared to lead us straight to the best of this world, if we are prepared to follow.

From our vision of God as Trinity—God's own life is a shared life— we are reminded of the importance of our mutually interacting relationships. We are "all connected" as a community of faith, hope and love. More importantly, we are called to a shared living with the Three who are one God, with other people and with our whole created environment building a community of justice and peace. Our understanding of the Trinity may always be imperfect and incomplete. We may never fully understand One God, Three Persons, and Distinct yet united. But when we gather as a community of faith to calabrate and wearhin we are living in its reality and for

when we gather as a community of faith to celebrate and worship, we are living in its reality and for good or ill we are the hands and feet of Christ today. What better way to celebrate this indwelling, this communion of the Trinity with creation than in the Eucharist, when bread and wine, some of the "stuff" of creation, become through the Spirit the Body and Blood of Christ, which we take into ourselves so that God lives in us and we in God?
