The Solemnity of the most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Hungry hearts are all around us and Christ offers us his body and blood, and when we eat and drink, we, in turn, become part of the Body of Christ. That is what we believe about the Eucharist. But that is not the end of the story; it is only the beginning. Becoming part of the Body of Christ means that we are united in Christ--in spirit and flesh--with the People of God, and together we offer ourselves as "holy and living sacrifices" and are sent forth to do God's will. Our daily actions, our work, and our relationships must now incorporate Christ. The Body and Blood of Christ is not only something we "get" at every Eucharist. It is also what we become. That is the part that intrigued the mystics, who wrote often of how God dwells in us and we in God. We receive Christ. We become Christ. And we go forth to bring Christ out to a world in great need of this food. Our society is dying of a thousand unnamed hungers yet heading out day after day, generation after generation, for the "happy meals" of wealth, power, and privilege; romance, sensation, addiction; entertainment, amusement, distraction—hoping for satisfaction from all these. Those meals serve many, it is true. And they may look nice on a platter. But the reason the world keeps serving them up is because we are bound to return, with empty plates and emptier spirits.

For over two thousand years, Christians have come together to share bread and wine. In these momentous words and in these beautiful gestures, Jesus summed up the very meaning of his life. What Jesus is saying is: "This is I, as I give myself in total obedience to the Father and in unconditional service to you." This bread and this wine are the signs of his life, a life that he has not lived for himself, but in total dedication to his Father and to us. When we eat this bread and this drink the wine, we profess our faith in Jesus and we become one with him, so that his life becomes ours: eating this bread and drinking this wine are signs of an encounter with Jesus himself, because it is his flesh and blood. Jesus' self-giving, his flesh and blood, is handed on to us, so that his self-giving may become flesh and blood in us.

These gestures, however simple, turn our lives upside down. Let us face it: our world is often like a battlefield, where people tear each other to pieces, and it seems to be getting worse. But what we do here in this sacred ritual is precisely the contrary. It shows the exact opposite of what we too often see lived. It shows us Jesus giving himself. When we eat and drink here, we accept the life of Jesus as our own. We let him be the norm of our dealing with each other. When we eat and drink here, we are not putting the flowers on the grave of someone who is dead. On the contrary, we let our lives be shaped and permeated by him who still lives, but now in us. We eat the bread and drink the wine in memory of Jesus, with the hope that his self-giving may become flesh and blood in us. One final note, remember how fervently we prayed after receiving Communion as a child? Where has that faith gone? Remember how much we trusted that Jesus would hear our prayers and protect us? Can we return to that same simple but profound belief that Jesus comes into our hearts in such an intimate way when we receive the Eucharist, that it has a noticeable effect on us not just during those moments after Communion, but long after we have left the church building?

Eligibility requirements:

Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.

Strong academic marks with experience in church, community involvement and volunteer work.

Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.

A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: Maximum of \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.

OFFERTORY AND A NOTE ON GIVING


