Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel story is about Jesus stilling the storm. The story is often used to show how great and powerful Jesus is in references to the forces of nature. For me, it is much more fascinating to see how Jesus approaches his disciples in their fear. He asks them "*why are you so frightened? Why do you not dare to believe in me?*" These are words that appear quite frequently in the Gospel, words of Jesus to people who are frightened, who know themselves as sinners, who feel rejected: "*Have no fear; I am here.*" The disciples were people very much like us; people with their failures, with their desires, with their moments of fear; moments of care and love for each other. In their contact with Jesus they had an overwhelming experience; the experience that Jesus stood by them in their fear, that he broke through their fears; the experience that his love was so heartwarming that the fear by which they felt imprisoned evaporated. How liberating it must have been to meet a man who was so disarming; he literally enables them to drop the weapons of fear and threat, because they do not need them anymore. That experience was so overwhelming, so overwhelming that later they could not describe what he meant to them in any other way than as someone who could still the storm. He had such a big heart for people that he could still the storm of fear.

One of the messages of the storm story is that the Lord remains with the church in the storm. The Lord is present to his fearful and faithless disciples. He may rebuke us as he rebuked those disciples in the boat. However, his presence to us in the storm is not just a rebuking presence. It is ultimately a creative and life-giving presence. Jesus brought calm out of the chaos; he tamed the storm and saw to it that the boat reached the other side. The Lord remains stronger than the storms that threaten the church, whether those storms are self-inflicted or brought on by others or a combination of both. Like the apostles, we need to trust that Our Lord works to bring his church through the storm to a new place where, as in their case, fear gives way to awe and their rebuking question, 'Master, do you not care?' gives way to amazement, 'Who can this be? Even the winds and sea obey him.' This conviction (that the Lord of the church is stronger than the storm) should not make us complacent. Yet, it keeps us hopeful and faithful, even when so much seems under threat. What today's Gospel story summons us to is to have no fear, to give ourselves over to a God who knows our hearts and who loves us to the end? It is indeed interesting that Jesus calms the storm with a word or two, by the same authority that once created the universe. "Have you still no faith?" he asks those terrified disciples. They don't reply, but the answer is obvious: not enough to quell their fear. Still, Jesus is in their boat, and they're going to survive this crossing. God in Jesus calms even what seems like the most unconquerable disturbances, like storms at sea. What "storms" assail your faith? How do you look to Jesus to quiet your fears? It is truly remarkable how the love of God in Christ urges us on, even when we are battling against a headwind. It urges us on until we reach what the gospel calls 'the other side', the place towards which the Lord is guiding the church — the place where he wants us all to be.

I must go down to that sea again,

FR. LEO ROBERTS BURSARY

Eligibility requirements:

Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.

Strong academic marks with experience in church, community involvement and volunteer work.

Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.

A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: Maximum of \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.

Diocesan Blog: Novena and Act of Entrustment to Saint Joseph begins June 22, 2021.

We've just passed the halfway point of the Year of St. Joseph that was proclaimed last December (<https://www.rcdvictoria.org/news/the-year-of-st-joseph>). To help us mark this special year, the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops has announced a national Novena and Act of Entrustment to Saint Joseph, to be held from June 22 – July 1.

For each of the nine days between June 22 and June 30, the CCCB has provided a reflection, a prayer, and a call to action (<https://www.cccb.ca/wp-content/uploads/2021/06/St.-Joseph-Novena-EN.pdf>). Catholics in Canada are invited to participate in this Novena to implore Saint Joseph's intercession for the welfare of the entire country, for the many needs of society, and to pray in particular for those who passed away due to COVID-19, the children who died in the residential schools era, and the healing that truth can bring.

Then, on July 1st, Bishops across the country will celebrate the Act of Entrustment to Saint Joseph in their respective dioceses. You can participate in the Diocese of Victoria's celebration by tuning in to the 7:00 pm PDT livestream Mass at <https://www.youtube.com/c/RCDVictoriaLiveOne>.
