SUNDAY June 21, 2020 Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Fear no one," Jesus says. Not long after, he nuances this command: Fear only the one who can destroy the soul along with the body. Soul killing may sound esoteric, but it is so common nowadays. We live in fear that is stoked by every news flash, renewed with each banner headline. And as Pope Francis points out, fear makes us cruel. The Pope says fear is what drives a community to build walls, deny the other, and abandon the poor. What are we so afraid of that we should surrender our better natures?

Today, we are reminded that Jesus not only says, "Fear no one," but elsewhere he declares, "Fear is useless". To which he appends the important dictum: "What is needed is faith. "The anxieties of the present are real. But every act of generosity we extend robs them of their authority. Virtues like love, kindness, and inclusion defeat the power of fear that seeks to kill the soul. The mandate to protect the common good, which assures everyone gets what they need even in a time of scarcer resources, heals division, and clears the path toward a more gracious future. If what is needed is faith, then, O Lord, increase our faith! Let us recall too that faith is not about believing certain things. It is about trusting in the God who believes in us enough to entrust the welfare of our neighbor into our care. Why then do so many focus on sin and not love? There is a way out!

In our readings today we see and hear a way out that works; fearless images feed our sense of life. Jesus tells his disciples to speak of him - to witness to the world about his message of love, of inclusion, of peace, of justice, of care for the poor. What happens when people proclaim such messages? What happens when people tell the truth in love? The readings today are concerned with this problem, namely, what happens when the living of the Gospel is taken seriously. We are being reminded today that to become a follower of Christ in the full sense, that to spread his message of love, justice and peace in word and practice will be seen by some people as a real threat to be resisted. Jesus reassures us in the gospel today that our heavenly father would protect us here on earth. Jesus invites us not to be afraid. Jeremiah echoes the same message in the first reading, calling God his mighty champion.

How do we know we are loved? It is more than a matter of hearing the words or seeing them written in a card. Love has something to do with fidelity: showing up, being there, not leaving when the stampede is moving in the direction of the door. Love makes sacrifices, shares times of want along with seasons of plenty. Love generously supports and honestly challenges. Love lets go when the time is right. On

this Father's Day, celebrate those who have embraced the vocation to show a father's love and helped you recognize your true worth. On this Father's Day, let us take some comfort that God has been and will be with us no matter what we face in life. We will not be left alone.

FR. LEO ROBERTS BURSARY

Eligibility requirements:

Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.

Strong academic marks with experience in church, community involvement and volunteer work.

Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.

A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: Maximum of \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.

Deadline: Saturday, June 30, 2020
