# SUNDAY June 17th, 2018 The Nativity of Saint John the Baptist

### Reflections from the Gospel Gals

Today's gospel on the birth and naming of John the Baptist is familiar to us, as are many Sunday Scripture readings. After all, we've heard them countless times. However, there is always something new even in the most familiar narratives and John the Baptist is no exception.

In this gospel we take pause for a few questions. What is God saying to <u>me</u> in this scripture? How does he want his word to work out in my daily life? What does he want me to do ... to do differently ... to give me new life, life extended outward to the other?

Central to the gospel is the 'naming' of the new baby, the baby conceived in old age, a conception unbelievable to Zachariah who months earlier thought the possibility impossible for which he was rendered unable to speak. Family, friends and neighbours stood in awe of God's blessing to Elizabeth and Zachariah and wondered what this could mean.

Elizabeth said the baby's name was to be John, not Zachariah after his father, not any family, relative or ancestral name. Can you just imagine the reactions she got with that announcement? Bemusement, indignation and attempts to set her straight. However, Elizabeth broke with tradition and expectations; she willingly stood apart; she stood tall and strong in rebuke; she risked being different to do what she knew was right, what was God's will; she opened to new expectations, new possibilities; she put herself on the 'fringe'. Something new was born!

How often do 'ancestral names' keep us prisoners, keep us from total commitment to and communion with Jesus and become our modus operandi in life? How often do we do things the same way we always have and the way everyone expects, pray in the same way that we always have, hold with the same rituals, rigidity, opinions and outlooks that we always have -- be they religious practices, personal beliefs, social and restorative justice, incarceration, immigration, economic prosperity, street people? Do we stay in the same familiar, comfortable environments that we always have? Years ago, talking to a class of newly minted teachers Sr. Mary Nolasco, a well-respected Sister of Mercy from Newfoundland, gave the teachers sage advice. She said that if, at the end of their teaching careers, their teaching experience was simply the number of years taught multiplied by one equalled one, where the teachers did the same things in the same way year-in and year-out so much would have been lost. The same can be said of us. If we are the same now in our Christian life as we have always been much may have been lost.

God is never finished with any of us, at least not on this side of eternity. He wants to stir us to new life in him; he wants us to examine our Christian way of being, to look for 'new names'. This week let's take time to reflect upon our ancestral names. Think long upon one ancestral name that holds you back and in honest prayerful reflection ask Jesus to open you to new ways, his ways. Have no doubt, Jesus will show you where you can be like Elizabeth and in grace-filled expectation give a new name, new life, new hope to something. In doing so we will live God's kingdom on earth and even more we may bring God's kingdom to someone else; we will be set free to walk alongside Jesus without fear; we will experience the conversion to which we are ever moving.
