

There is a line in today's Gospel which intrigues me. It is the one which says: "fear no one for nothing is covered up that will not be uncovered, and nothing secret that will not become known." What is it we feel when we hear this proclaimed? We all live with fear - fear confronts us everyday. Survey after survey indicates that fear is

Every time we hear the same kind of watchword in Scripture, "Fear not," whether uttered by a prophet or by a heavenly messenger, whether addressed to an individual or to a community, we should be reassured. But at the same time, if God or Jesus or one of their messengers deems it necessary to summon us to courage, it means that fear has in some way or other come over us and that there are serious challenges lying ahead.

But who said that faith should come easy? Ask a great prophet like Jeremiah who had to struggle all his life not only because of the political and social crises unfolding before him, but in order to understand God's ways and to remain faithful to the message he was asked to proclaim. Yet, Jeremiah never gave up; he kept the faith and succeeded in delivering a wonderful message of hope to his contemporaries who had otherwise every reason to fear.

Jesus tells his disciples to speak of him - to witness to the world about his message of love, of inclusion, of peace, of justice, of care for the poor. What happens when people proclaim such messages? Today's Gospel reminds us that we do have a responsibility to stand up and be counted. And, thank God, many are still doing so. "If anyone declares himself for me in the presence of others, I will declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. But the one who disowns me in the presence of others, I will disown in the presence of my Father in heaven."

May we continue to live our lives knowing that we will always be strengthened by the knowledge that we are held in God's hand and protected by God's love? Let Jesus shape your life, let light shine in dark places and may we continue to live where God is knowing he will always hold us up and sustain us, come what may. Fear not but always in all places, and in all things, tell the truth in love.
