SUNDAY June 28, 2020 Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

At first glance, the Gospel from Matthew this week, a continuation of Jesus' instructions to his Apostles, seems harsh and surprising. "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is *not worthy of me*". I am thankful for the wisdom of the Church for placing these readings into the post-Easter Season timeframe. We have had many deep and foundational Scripture teachings for many weeks now, and this reading is given as direction as much for us as for the Apostles.

Jesus conquered death for all of us through the Resurrection – Joy! He continued to teach us before Ascending into Heaven – Wisdom! And he sent the Spirit of Love to guide and inspire us on the Feast of Pentecost – Courage! We were reminded of the power of relational Love on Trinity Sunday - Communion! And we were reminded on Corpus Christi of the sustaining power of Christ in the Eucharist, for our benefit and in order that we might have the heart and be the hands of Christ on earth now - Food for the Journey!

What is Jesus really saying today? Love! My best friend in life gave me some sage advice: the emphasis of Matthew's teaching should not be on 'not worthy of me', but on the words 'more than'. The Spirit resides in all of us, so the message is to love Jesus as we love the most cherished people in our lives and each other as we would love Jesus. The messages of Easter Season Scripture should give us confidence that we have received the gifts we need to accomplish this.

Events of these past months have stopped the world in its tracks. There is no denying the hardship and tragedy of the sickness and death caused by this invisible invader. But it is also impossible to view recent events without wonder; the effects of 'stopping the world' seems to have pushed a reset button.

Spinoffs of the stoppage amazed us. Severely restricted world travel resulted in a sudden global reduction of energy usage, visibly impacting the environment almost immediately; cessation of the wheels of industry in many polluted cities around the world quickly created remarkably improved air quality.

But the responses actively pursued, inspired by critical reflection, have been stunning. It strikes me that the foundation of these is our return to our true selves, founded in Love. For years societal problems have been 'discussed' and solutions have been 'suggested' but all too often not implemented. In this critical time there has been unprecedented, swift and powerful action to right these wrongs. People on the streets who have previously been ignored or reviled are now being cared for, in proper housing. Those who have been marginalized and discriminated against for centuries have been emboldened and are demanding change. The world is not only listening, but responding. There have been some hard lessons. The identification of the dangers of the poor quality of living conditions in some long-term care facilities have prompted new policies that will not be ignored because of the pain and determination of those who have lost family members. Many families are recognizing the value of a return to family time, enriching 'family', regardless of their ability to be physically present to each other. Historically, health care workers and essential workers have been underpaid and often taken for granted. They are now valued more than ever. Sidewalk chalk art produced by the youngest among us inspires and encourages us to be strong and hopeful.

We all have a heightened awareness of the depths of our 'heart' for the value of life, the importance of embracing social responsibility and social justice, and the need to truly care for and love each other. Joy! Wisdom! Courage! Communion! And, remember the Food for the Journey!

"God is Love and all who live in Love live in God." A reminder to the world. May it endure.

FR. LEO ROBERTS BURSARY

Eligibility requirements:

Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.

Strong academic marks with experience in church, community involvement and volunteer work.

Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.

A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: Maximum of \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.

Deadline: Saturday, June 30, 2020 Last weekend to apply!
