SUNDAY - June 6 2021 The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Covenant, an agreement between two parties, a relationship between God and humanity, a bond of grace with all creation. A covenant was made when God's word is heard and responded to. It combines obligation and obedience, blessings, presence and protection. God chooses us, through no merit of our own. God desires a life of communion with us. The relationship is a covenant of love like that of Shepherd and flock, vinedresser and branch, loving parent and prodigal son/daughter, bridegroom and spouse, 'you are my people, I am your God', and finally, as the Body of Christ.

Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham and Sarah, Jacob, Joseph, Moses; from patriarchs and their families to an entire nation, Israel, God's covenant is formed and people promise to obey as sacrificial blood is sprinkled. Invariably, a pattern emerges. The covenant is broken by their infidelities while God's faithfulness remains constant. These external covenants where animals were sacrificed and the people were bound by the letter of the law are replaced by Christ's life blood poured out once for all, filling our hearts with His transforming love, creating an internal change of heart and will, as we become the Body of Christ.

God promises a messianic prophecy with the Davidic covenant that links the Old Testament to the New Testament, a final covenant, an internal, universal covenant with Christ himself the high priest, Christ himself the final sacrifice, His body the Ark of the covenant, the temple, the Holy of holies, entering into our heart of flesh as His blood washes us clean. This self-giving covenant of love takes sins away, transforms our hearts, fills us with the Holy Spirit, and invites us to dance with the Most Holy Trinity.

By blessing, breaking, and giving, Jesus offers the gift of Himself to us. Again we are asked to respond. Do we value this gift? Have we prepared our hearts to receive it? Are we willing to die to self and surrender to God's will? Receiving the body and blood of Christ brings healing, freedom, and transformation. Eucharist deepens our union with Christ. In thanksgiving and blessing, we come to the Lord Jesus with a contrite heart, taking Jesus into our innermost being, as we offer ourselves to one another as the body of Christ.

Is our commitment to God a sprinkling of blood or do we take the cup given and drink fully? May our response to God's final covenant be like the opening stanza of Franciscan Friar Scott Surrency's poem "Can you drink the cup?"

Drink, not survey or analyze, ponder or scrutinize from a distance. But drink — imbibe, ingest, take into you so that it becomes a piece of your inmost self.

FR. LEO ROBERTS BURSARY

Eligibility requirements:

Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.

Strong academic marks with experience in church, community involvement and volunteer work.

Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.

A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: Maximum of \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.
