# SUNDAY - June 9, 2024 Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In a month when school-age children look forward to closing their books for some well-needed summer fun, I have packed up two offices and am about to begin anew on the Westshore. This will be my last bulletin article and "once more my deepest self flows" as I bid adieu but know you are in my prayers, and I thank you for allowing me to be your pastor. I write this reflection while on retreat listening to the wisdom of Archbishop Richard Smith who started our retreat by telling us that we who announce the Gospel are not getting through in our culture. Imagine that! We live at a time when the voice of Jesus is tuned out! What to do? Archbishop Smith invited us priests to return to Galilee and remember the time when we were won over by God's grace. Do you remember that moment in your own life? Origins are everything in a culture where shifting sands have no connection with the creator. On this retreat, I thought of my parents who brought me to Jesus and all who walked with me as we walked together in ministry to build community and share the good news! As I reflect on the readings this week, it struck me that what is happening in our culture also happened to Jesus.

A thread running through today's readings is about the threat of evil in human existence. If you expose yourself to the news today, you will learn the same thing Genesis warns about. There's trouble in Paradise. Things aren't as they should be, and someone (or lots of someone's) will pay a bitter price for this. Media assures us daily we're one step from apocalypse. Take a hint from the Bible: Every generation is apocalyptic. Humanity is always poised on the brink of disaster. I'm not denying it; I'm saying it's nothing new. So, relax. We have lived in apocalypse our whole life and are no worse for the wear. As student of history there are always tensions between our highest calling and our deepest fall.

Today in the Gospel, Jesus is poised on the brink, with accusations all around. His family thinks he's crazy. Enemies call him possessed. What does Jesus do? The master pastor roots himself down in the fabulous unseen: his Father's love, abundant life, a new family composed of spirit and truth. We can trust the trouble, or we can trust the Lord. Because God is always calling. We can hide—or come forth. To belong to Jesus is equally open to all; the only condition is our readiness to commit oneself to doing the Father's will. This was the commitment that Adam and Eve failed to make but which is opened to us in Christ. As I looked at beautiful carving of Jesus in this chapel entrusting his Mother to the beloved disciple it hit me, God got this! My dear friends, God got you, me, the world in the palm of His hands and all we need to do is look at Jesus and allow him to look back at us! What does Jesus looking at you feel like? In closing, Holy Cross and Saint Patrick's thank you for allowing me to be your shepherd! In a polarized world of disunity choose unity in Christ! Making loving acts of kindness "normal" is the dangerous game Christ calls us all to play.

Amid all the forces at work in our world to tune out the voice of God remember the covenant and never forget that we are the beloved of God. As the beloved of God let us root ourselves in holiness, communion, and Joy. Are we willing to surrender and trust that God will give us all we need! Aesop proclaimed... united we stand, divided we fall.

Eyes on Jesus and let us continue to love and serve,

### Word of the Week:

#### Grace

Unmerited divine assistance given; freely given; God's favor that comes sacramentally, situationally, and habitually. Saint Paul identifies Jesus as the "grace of God" and sees grace as operating in the many charisms that build up the church. What is grace? The simple definition of grace is God's favor. But what it means to receive such benevolence is demonstrated in boundless ways. How do we "get" grace, or know it when it's operating? We recognize grace in the divine mercy, forgiveness, and rescue at work in our lives. The church's sacraments are ways in which we acquire grace. Church fathers went so far as to say that sacraments "divinize" us: God becomes flesh so that flesh can share in God's immortality. Saint Augustine proposed that grace heals and liberates our sin-inclined wills so we can do the will of God. Without grace, we're literally lost. Saint Thomas Aguinas envisioned grace as elevating us to a higher level of union with God. Thomas Merton saw grace as the antidote to the "death dance" in our blood. However you define grace, it comes to us unmerited and free of charge. God doesn't "owe" us grace even if we're saintly every moment of the day. But like any gift that comes in a pretty package, grace is not fully received if we don't open the gift and make use of it. Sin separates us from following in the way designed by God for our happiness. Grace makes it possible for us to find our way back to that divine path. The gift of grace empowers us to live in communion with God both in this world and in the world to come. From the Catechism of the Catholic Church: Grace is participation in the life of God. It introduces us into the intimacy of Trinitarian life. The grace of Christ is the gratuitous gift that God makes to us of his own life, infused by the Holy Spirit into our soul to heal it of sin and to sanctify us (CCC 1997-99).

The Blessed Marie Anne Blondin Bursary (\$1000): for a lay woman who is accepted or enrolled in a program or course for ministry in the Church, such as religious education, social justice, liturgy, social action, care of the sick, etc. The Char Deslippe Memorial Award (\$500): for a teacher working in Island Catholic Schools or a parish catechist serving in children, youth or adult ministry.
