# **SUNDAY - March 12th, 2023**The Third Sunday of Lent

The Samaritan woman represents us. We meet a woman who was trying to discover her deepest truth, looking for acceptance, love and trust, rejecting that which fails to satisfy, and engaging Jesus, this Jewish man by the side of the well, in a faith dialogue about what true worship really means. This woman at the well - a woman without a name so she can stand for every woman (and hopefully for every man)- is a woman who thirsts for truth. She is a woman who longs for relationship (during all the forces of her culture at work against her, the most obvious being exclusion). The woman who finds herself in the company of Jesus at the well would not have mistaken him for a tangible aspect of the divinity, that's for sure. For one thing, he was a Jew, the enemy of her people. For another, he was a man, and she'd known several men. And yet this very worldly and world-weary woman can sense the divine spirit in a most unexpected place for two reasons: First, she asks the right questions, and second, she listens to the answers. The first response puts her in a rare category, and the other puts her above most of Jesus' own disciples.

It's instructive to note that even after participating in miracles, healings, and years of teaching, it took an event like the Transfiguration for the disciples to suspect that Jesus was more than he seemed. The Samaritan woman intuited this in a short conversation. Jesus didn't miraculously fill her bucket or take the pain out of her much-used heart. He did not even forgive her sins. He just talks to her. He talks about things that are directly relevant to her: water, relationships, God, and truth. He reveals his identity to her because she, as it turns out, has been seeking him all along. Jesus rarely meets anyone willing to look beyond religion to encounter its true purpose. Many Samaritans came to believe in Jesus because of the woman's witnessing. Then they asked him to stay with them, otherwise he would have continued on his journey. Jesus often needs to be invited to stay. Remember the two men walking to Emmaus? He would not have stopped if they had not invited him to stay the night. He stands at the door and knocks but he will not come in unless invited.

My dear friends, we are still a long way from the flowing waters of our Easter Celebrations. Over the next three weeks let us continue to be vigilant in fasting and prayer. Let us look within the places of our heart where we are thirsty for truth, for authentic love, for relationship, and for living water. When we reach out with compassion and acceptance to all people we too will find the grace to overcome what stands in the way of befriending and loving all the people in our lives. Jesus knows the deepest longing of our heart and like the woman at the well we too should be staggered at Jesus' insight into our life. He knocks on our hearts door and waits for the invitation. Proverbs 18:4 speaks of deep wisdom. The words of the mouth are deep waters; the fountain of wisdom is a gushing stream.

Looking forward to seeing you at our Lenten Mission.
