SUNDAY - March 14, 2021 Fourth Sunday in Lent

We are a little more than halfway into Lent. You could call it our journey through the desert, our journey to Easter, the light, and the new life. We Christians go this path like everyone else, like ordinary people; like men and women who are marked by everything that happens in our world. There is a lot of misery, a lot of sin, a lot of powerlessness, a lot of hostility, a lot of not knowing where we are going. As Christians, we are not protected from the disillusionment of life. It is moments like these that we can hear ourselves say: "Where is our God? Does he really care?" Perhaps we would not dare to say it, but don't we often think: what is the use of being Christian in a world where you must fend for yourself, where you should not get your expectations too high, because you are bound to get hurt and disillusioned?" Jesus himself appears on our path today, halfway into Lent, halfway to Easter. And he points us to the cross on which he will be lifted up. And dear friends the verdict is love.

The cross is placed here in our midst not as a reminder of what we, in our sinfulness, have done or left undone, nor as a reminder of what, in our powerlessness, we cannot do, but as a reminder of the lasting truth that God does not condemn us, but saves us. And we look up to that cross, not out of a sense of pity and shame, but as an acknowledgement of the fact that if it had not been for our having stumbled on this kind of a God in Jesus, we would certainly drown and go under in our misery and sin, in our powerlessness and hostility, in our not knowing where we are going. If the cross is a sign of anything at all, then it is a sign of the certainty that a faithful God stands by us and is prepared to slug it out with us. We have him to cling to, and if we look attentively at him, we see that his hands and heart are open to us. The cross signifies for us that God's entire existence is one of being given for us. With that kind of God in our lives, we will not have to go under.

When Nicodemus sought out Jesus, he was in the dark both literally and symbolically. He could not see clearly. In the years that followed this late-night conversation, Nicodemus became a follower of Jesus and, step by step, was drawn to see things differently. At last, he finally did see. When at the end, Jesus was really and truly lifted up, Nicodemus was not too far away. When the ancient people refused to follow God, their own way took them to destruction. But God is rich in mercy and has worked throughout history to save even the unfaithful. Believing in Jesus means following his ways.

When we meditate on the crucifix and participate in the Eucharist we also see Jesus lifted up. Perhaps today as we lift our eyes to see him, we might ponder on the mystery of suffering and exaltation and wonder at the love that is lifted up and draws us ever closer, uplifting us as well.


