SUNDAY March 18th, 2018 Fifth Sunday in Lent

From the desk of Father William

When asked why she opposed Medical Aid in death she responded, is death the answer to everyone who suffers? A good question!!! We don't go looking for suffering but when it comes we will have to respond and today, Jesus shows us how to respond. "Father, save me from this hour... now my soul is troubled." That is the cry of Jesus when he comes face to face with the tragedy of his life and when he must enter the school of suffering. And he wonders out loud: "what shall I say?" It is a question that comes straight from the heart of someone

who begins to taste the cruelty and bitterness of life, the inhumane features that mark life for many.

It becomes even more paradoxical when we consider that it is Jesus who utters these words. His life has been marked by resisting every form of suffering and he knew himself called to be the healer of broken persons. But despite his healing commitment he finds himself up against a power that will also claim him: the power of suffering and death. He learns first hand the human situation of suffering and dying. He prays aloud and in silent tears. It is the instinctive reaction of people when confronted with suffering: "Father, save me from this hour."

But he does not stay there! The gospel today presses on. When Jesus is shaken by the thought of his immanent suffering and death he turns to God, he clings to him. Precisely at this moment, Jesus cannot and will not let go of God. He continues to believe that, despite contrary evidence, God is his life and his future. When all becomes darkness around him, he remains tuned into the God who has been the ground of his life-project. He pleads with God: "Father, glorify your name." Mysterious words, no doubt. Words by which we will continue to be puzzled and embarrassed. "Father, glorify your name." In these words, Jesus consents to the fact that in his suffering and death God will show his divine compassion for his people.

What an incomprehensible turn of events! When Jesus in his suffering and death remains faithful and obedient to God, God in turn binds himself in an unheard way to us people. The suffering and death of Jesus becomes for God the occasion to show his presence and saving solidarity with us. That is the New Covenant. In the suffering and dying Jesus, God binds himself irrevocably to us his people. It is a bonding that is marked by love and fidelity.

The point of Christian faith is not to lose your life, but to save it. Preserving our lives for eternity does involve a temporal surrender. It does mean meeting the hour of death head-on, by investing in it through the choices of this hour and every hour. May our choice always lead to life and development in peace.

Time is short, but eternity is not.
