SUNDAY - March 20, 2022

Third Sunday of Lent

Scripture this week assures us that God hears the cries of God's people, knows our suffering, and rescues us. The gardener in the Gospel asked the owner of the vineyard to give the barren fig tree another chance to produce fruit. He promised to dig around it and manure it, to give it one last chance to prove itself. It suggests that we too need to nurture our faith and commit ourselves to being helpful to the lives of others. Are we nurturing our faith and trying to love, so as to bear the kind of fruit God wants from us? When have you felt that God has rescued you? The fig tree of the gospel parable received another year to grow and prove its worth. What can you do in your spiritual life that will bear fruit in the future? Memory is powerful. What we remember as a church makes the saving events of the past alive and effective now. This Lent, what important things are you "remembering"?

Given the choice, most of us would prefer to attract God's compassion and avoid the near occasion of crisis. How do we do that? In a word, repent. This is a potent word for the season of Lent—not to mention every other season. It does not mean wallowing in self-recrimination and self-loathing, but it does mean stopping on a dime and changing direction. The fig trees on the clock now, and there is a limit to what the orchard owner will endure. In the final hour, Jesus is not going to ask us about our rationale, which flag we lived under, or whose guilt came first. The gardener looks for fruit on the tree, and come next inspection, there'd better be some. The parable of the fruitless fig tree is thought-provoking. It is not about doing wrong but about failure to do what is positively right. The fig tree that bore no fruit is like a Christian who attempts no good work and lives a purely selfish life.

The parable of the fig tree is a story about compassion and crisis, according to Franciscan scholar Robert Karris. As "nice" as the gardener is about the fruitless tree, he does not bargain for a full pardon. He asks only for one more year. This request reminds us of the classic question: If you knew you had only one year to live, what would you do differently? For a lot of people, the honest answer would be not very much. We live as we do as a matter of choice, and if we wanted to change, we would already be committed to the process. As a priest I have seen what dying people do with their time, and many continue to do precisely

what they have done all along. The angry rage, those in denial pretend, the depressed become increasingly immobilized, and the bitter remain diamond hard but many accept acceptance and go gently into the good night.



EASING OF RESTRICTIONS

The General and Liturgical Directives and Music Ministry Covid-19 Prevention Plan, to be followed by all parishes in the Diocese of Victoria, have been updated according to the most recent PHO's.

To summarize:

- Capacity limits on attendance at worship services or other gatherings in church buildings are no longer required. It is highly recommended that parishes continue to encourage physical distancing.
- The use of face coverings is now optional in church buildings. However, the continued use of face coverings is highly recommended as a prudent and wise choice to ensure the safety of all. This is especially true during higher-risk situations such as while singing or while distributing Communion.
