SUNDAY - March 26th, 2023The Fifth Sunday of Lent

Today, March 26th, is the Fifth Sunday of Lent and today's scriptures tell us in several ways that we don't have to fear death, that every experience of death is with, and within God's spirit. The first reading by Ezekiel exclaims thus says the Lord God: "I am going to open your graves and bring you up from your graves." Paul writes in the second reading, if the Spirit of God who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will give life to your mortal bodies also through his Spirit that dwells in you. Psalm 130 reassures us that with the Lord there is steadfast love and great power to redeem. And finally, John's Gospel tells us the extraordinary story of the raising of Lazarus.

The account was written with many details; the message from the sisters to Jesus, the concern of the disciples to return to Bethany, the crowds gathering to mourn, Lazarus being in the tomb four days, and notably the faith of Martha and Mary. Both of the sisters expressed their sincere belief that if Jesus had visited Lazarus when he was ill, Lazarus would have lived. They had no doubts! It is clear that they witnessed many of the healings performed by Jesus during the past months. They listened to his words of love and mercy, his words on forgiveness and solidarity. Martha and Mary reflected on what they saw and heard, and their belief grew. We hear their voices two thousand years later and their faith inspires us. We, too, have witnessed God in our lives. We, too, have listened to his words. As we reflect on God's steadfast love and mercy, our own faith grows.

In the account of this miraculous happening are some of the most startling words expressed by Jesus. I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. This is the Good News; this is the fulfillment of our faith - this is preposterous! Jesus knew we would have trouble accepting such a

challenging concept and so that we might believe, he raised Lazarus who had been in a tomb for four days from the dead. Not even death can withstand the love and power of Jesus. He truly is the resurrection and the life. He truly is the way, the truth, and the life. He truly is the Christ, the Son of God.

How blessed are we to know and believe!
