### SUNDAY March 4th, 2018 Third Sunday in Lent

#### From the desk of Father William

Sometimes when people hear today's Gospel - of Jesus clearly angry, overturning the money changers' tables and driving them out of the temple - people ask if this could be right? Jesus' anger is a zeal for truth, a thirst for honest dealing and a yearning for a faith that comes from the heart - not words only, but words that are expressed in deeds. The story of Jesus chasing the money changers and the livestock merchants out of the temple is more than a simple report on a clean-up operation. There is more here than meets the eye.

The Passover of the Jews was near, the text says. But just before Passover, it was big business in the temple in Jerusalem. That was the time all sorts of arrangements had to be offered in observance of the law. That explains the presence of the money changers and the livestock merchants in the temple. It was all part of the elaborate sacrificial system, by means of which the people at the time thought they had to worship God.

The action of Jesus, chasing the money changers and livestock merchants out of the temple, is an awfully radical action. What it really means is that Jesus declares the ritual sacrifices in the temple and the entire elaborate sacrificial system, as obsolete. It is the end of an era! If God is to be worshipped, then it will be no longer be in the temple with ritual sacrifices; it will be no longer in one designated sacred space and with external ritual practices. The point is we can't limit our worship to what we do here. In this Lenten season, we must be willing to place ourselves, our actions, our lifestyles, under the critique implied in today's Gospel reading. That we worship God is a necessity; we cannot do without it. But in that case it is important that we do not limit our worship of God to what we do when we come together in this place.

One of the radically new features of the Christian religion is that the real worship of God takes place not in a restricted sacred place, as a church building, but in our concrete daily actions. Jesus himself is the perfect embodiment of that new kind of worship. He did not worship God by means of a beautiful liturgical ceremony in the temple. He worshiped God by being obedient to the Father's will, and by life-giving service to those around him. Life itself has become the sacred space where God is worshipped. We are nourished here to go out there!!! In other words, it is only when our lives outside this place correspond with what we do in this place that we worship God authentically. Life itself has become the sacred place where God is worshipped. Life, the life of each of us, what we do and say in our daily lives is indeed where God is to be worshipped. Looking forward to seeing you at the Reconciliation Service on Thursday night!
