SUNDAY - March 6, 2022

First Sunday of Lent

Welcome to the first Sunday of Lent and a 40 day commitment to honour God and put God first before our own needs. Let us come to the altar of the Lord and humbly offer ourselves as firstfruit. Come with a grateful, contrite heart open to God's transforming grace, trusting that God hears our yearnings and guides us to the *Promised Land*.

We are called to exodus from judgment, criticism, fear, selfishness, a 'me' attitude, and let God transform our hearts of stone, shatter our patterns of sin, and deepen our understanding of a loving, merciful, faithful God. Lent is our annual pilgrimage to the *Promised Land*, to the deep recesses of our hearts where we abide with the indwelling God. God is our Promised Land, our dwelling place, our refuge and fortress where there is nothing to fear!

As we enter into Jesus' temptation in the wilderness, we are fortified with the acclamation that Jesus is God's Son, the Beloved, the one who comes for all, who is *full* of the Holy Spirit, and *led* by the Holy Spirit into this wilderness. Jesus doesn't go alone, and neither do we. He has God's affirmation and the support of the Holy Spirit as do we. Jesus knows the wilderness just as we know the wilderness story from the Bible and from our own lives. God heard the cries of the Israelites and brought them out of slavery into the wilderness where God provided for them. They were formed and shaped into God's covenant people. When we reflect back on our lives, we see how God was fully present to us in our wildernesses, and how we are continually refined by Divine Love.

Jesus shows us that we will always be tempted; it's the human condition. What matters is how we react (or how we respond, there's a difference). Do we invite God into the situation? Do we offer up a short prayer or use scripture to guide us? Do we trust in the divine providence of God to lead us through? The temptations portray a selfish grabbing and grasping at power, security, and status. Are we hoarding our gifts, playing games to bolster our position, or adding to the divisiveness in our world today through our judgments, slander, and intolerance?

In the first temptation, Jesus is asked to use his power for selfish purposes, to put his comfort and physical well -being first, before others – eat if you're hungry, why deprive yourself? We hear the world say to us, buy it now or do something nice for yourself, you deserve it. This temptation depicts a lack of trust in God for sustenance; we rely on ourselves, grab and horde, and put our needs first; a life of service and compassion for others is abandoned. God's Kingdom calls us to use our gifts for the greater good, to be of service, to be the good news.

The second temptation entices Jesus to worship the devil, a false god, to accomplish a good end (glory and authority) by evil means (worshiping the devil). Jesus obtains glory and authority by surrendering completely to God. His teaching, healing, forgiving, and suffering derive from God's glory and authority. Are we willing to kneel before the evil one to obtain power at any cost or do we follow Jesus who shows us the way through suffering with compassion and love, serving and worshiping God alone?

The third temptation tries to cast doubt on Jesus' identity, If you are the Son of God, and puts God to the test. Our own inner demons cast doubt telling us we are unworthy of God's love, that all is hopeless. The devil will not give up. Like Jesus, we must be vigilant as we tune our ears to God's voice, our hearts to God's Word, and our lives to God's ways. Don't let the devil in the driver's seat. We're not along for the ride! We know the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Call on the name of the Lord to help us fast from our needs, give from our gifts, and be the prayer that others need to hear.

This week the agreement between Holy Cross Parish and the Office for Refugees, Archdiocese of Toronto was formalized. A family of three, parents and their 21-year-old daughter, are in the last stages of having their application to come to Canada approved. They should be arriving within a couple of months if all continues to go well. In our initial email exchange, they relayed the following message: "I'm very thankful to you for your support. May God bless. We are very excited to see you soon." The Refugee Sponsorship Group is now preparing for the arrival of this family, and we are so grateful for your support and continuing prayers.


