SUNDAY - March 7, 2021 Third Sunday in Lent

The beginning of March, the coming of spring, and the dawning of light fills us with the hope of new life, just as our Lenten journey does. If we need a little *forward spring* in our Lenten step, the readings this Sunday will strengthen our Lenten practice in body, mind and spirit.

God calls us to live in right relationship with everyone and everything in this world. The Ten Commandments guide us to live holy lives (almsgiving), to keep our focus on God (prayer), and to fast by detaching ourselves from the false gods of this world that enslave us (greed, envy, pride, the 'isms'). God states, "I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the house of slavery". Our God is a personal God, not someone 'up' there, 'out' there, or 'over' there. Rather, our God is right 'here' beside us, walking with us, guiding us, and wanting to free us from all that holds us back from being God's Beloved!

God wants us to love, honour, and praise God with our whole being because it makes us better people. We become who we were created to be as our stories weave tightly into the fabric of God's great love story. On the seventh day God rested from creating, and we are called to do the same. In *Laudato Si* Pope Francis states that "work is a necessity, part of the meaning of life on this earth, a path to growth, human development and personal fulfilment." Work is a vocation; the Sabbath is a necessity. Rest blesses us, recreates us, and refocuses our attention on a loving, merciful, just God who is 'here' for us. Sabbath is a day of worship, delight and joy. We can bring the gift of Sabbath time into each of our days in the morning to align our day with God's desire for us and/or at the end of the day as we reflect on how God has been present to us. This practice creates an awareness of God in our lives and gratitude blooms.

The Greek word for honour means "to revere, prize, and value." By our words and actions, we are called to honour our father and mother, our elders, their wisdom and experience. By encountering others with respect, dignity, mercy, openness, and love, the last five commandments (murder, adultery, stealing, false witnessing, and coveting) won't even come into play. We are not meant to wander lost in a desert, thirsting and hungering, for we are a covenantal people where God speaks to our hearts and loves us into a greater sense of being.

In John's gospel, the temple, the holy place where God dwells, was being violated. Jesus shows righteous anger when he overturns the tables and chases the moneychangers out. While animals are needed for temple sacrifice, the markets were taking over the worship space and it became more a place to buy and sell. The 'doing' (commerce and exploitation) became the main focus and the 'being' (worship and reverence) became secondary.

Jesus takes things further and transforms temple sacrifice by freely offering Himself as the sacrifice. His body becomes the temple that will be raised up in three days. His unconditional love reveals a God who can't be bought and sold for favors. Jesus reminds us, especially in the Eucharist, how we are holy temples where God resides. Our sacrifice is a contrite heart. Like Jesus, we are called to tend the sacred space within.

As temple keepers, we need to ask ourselves a few questions. Have we desecrated our hearts with a marketplace mentality? Do we fuel our bodies with good nourishing food and water so we can grow stronger? Do we fill our thoughts with fear, pornography, conspiracy theories, or the Word of God? Do we focus our hearts on God or the ways of the world? What needs cleansing in us?

Let's deepen our Lenten journey by trusting in God's words, fasting from excessive work, internet surfing, boredom, Netflix binging or whatever it is that takes us away from God, and praying to become God's sacred vessels in a more profound way.
