

The Lenten terrain keeps changing. Last week, we crossed a desert. This week, we scale a mountain. No one said the journey of faith would be easy. Is the spiritual path really as challenging as the metaphors would make it seem? The answer is—hopefully. If we're doing it right, we ought to be flexing some serious spiritual muscle. Climbing that Lenten mountain with Jesus seems like a lot of hard work. But what do we encounter at the summit of the spiritual mountain? Something called Transfiguration. It means we see what was always there, but hidden before. We see truly. We see as God sees.

This new vision is given to those who are willing to go there to get it. It won't come to us if we don't climb the mountain. It won't come to those who are spiritually parked and waiting for enlightenment to be handed out the drive-thru window like a happy meal. Eucharist does not come in fast food varieties. Eucharist is slow food. It takes a lifetime of remaining steadfast on this journey to absorb it completely. But if we want a preview of coming attractions, if we want to know where this life is leading us, if we want what the disciples got on top of the mountain, we can have our glimpse of Transfiguration. It is a sustaining vision that can lend us courage in our most difficult hours. It is a privileged view that can teach us what no preacher can say better. The Transfiguration reveals the God in the flesh, and the glory in the humility. Transfiguration reminds us that Christ is hidden in surprising places, and that is why we fast, pray, and give alms. Christ is hiding right now in the poor ones. If we want to see him there, we have to take this path and climb this mountain. Where have you borne the "hardships" for the sake of the gospel, Saint Paul writes of in Romans? What were or are they? How does God strengthen you in the face of difficulties? Abraham sets forth into the unknown with nothing but God's promise. When have you found yourself in a similar situation? How has God led you, and how have you answered God's call? In the story of the Transfiguration, Saint Peter is in such awe and rapture that he does not want to leave. Where have you encountered such moments on the mountaintop, experiences of God so intense and satisfying you could have felt them forever?

Keep climbing.

The emergence of the new coronavirus (COVID-19) is impacting people worldwide and has led to understandable concern among the faithful. Coronaviruses are thought to be spread mainly from person to person through close contact. Entrusted with the mission of lesus to care for all the members of our community, parishioners are encouraged to observe the following:
