

In the second reading, Peter uses an image to describe the reality we are as Church. We are a house of living stones. This is a profound image for me, and two years ago I developed a series of talks on this image that I gave to a group of priests in Saskatchewan. The Church is built on Jesus Christ; he is God's delegated and precious living stone. Christ rejected and crucified, but now risen - he is now the life-giving Lord. He is the foundation, the very center of our faith. He is the cornerstone of us as Church.

What is so beautiful is that Peter summons us to keep coming day after day to Christ, the living stone, so that we ourselves may become living stones and share the life of Jesus. He invites us, in turn, to continue in joyful hope the ministry of Jesus for humankind. Peter knew what he was talking about because he kept coming back time after time, and let us be honest, when Jesus needed him the most, he jumped ship. The only thing that saved Peter was that he kept talking to the Lord. I love that; we must keep talking to the Lord.

What does it mean to become living stones? It means that we do not become isolated, petrified, and dead. Rather, we are made alive and we are being built into a house, which is enlivened by the Spirit. Christ is the cornerstone, and the Spirit enables all that come to Christ to be built into this house. In Peter's mind, we are all living stones, and we all form an integral part of God's house. And it is as such that we are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people.

What Peter suggests by these terms is that, to the extent that we cling to Jesus, and go his path, we are in the process of becoming the true human race made in the image of God. It is in our clinging to Jesus and in our following his path that the true humanity that God longs for becomes a promise and a reality.

There are also some basic ingredients that characterize us as the house of living stones. It comes down to some fundamental qualities and obligations: qualities, which enable its inhabitants to live together in community and in shared well-being; in shalom, peace. Where these qualities are lacking, the house cannot stand. The qualities that I am referring to are *justice, mercy*, and utter *loyalty* to God, the Lord of the house.

It is to the extent that we let our actions and words be permeated by these qualities that we are living stones, and what is more, that our lives become the worship that is acceptable to God. We let our worship be grafted onto that of Christ. Christ's worship was not performed in the temple, in an isolated place, but in life where he was obedient to God. Christ's worship consisted of life-giving service to all who were in need.

Brothers and sisters, that is our challenge; we together are responsible for figuring out how we together can be a vibrant baptized community. How can we support each other and help each other, when as baptized men and women we try to come to terms with Jesus being the Way, the Truth and the life for us? As we reflect on our mothers today, both living and deceased, we give thanks for our mothers being living stones for us in word and deed. Happy Mothers' Day.
