### SUNDAY May 12, 2019 Fourth Sunday of Easter

It is Mothers Day!!! We call this day also World Day of Prayer for Vocations and it was once called "Good Shepherd Sunday," but these days you don't see many shepherds in this part of the world, at least not the kind scripture is talking about. In a way mothers are our first shepherds who guide us towards all that is good and true. Our Mother's gave birth to us and today we give thanks for them and for all they do for us. I would like to continue reflecting on the theme of gathering that I have been developing the last few weeks. Why gather?

We have come together here in Jesus' name; we have placed ourselves under the word of Scripture, and in a few moments, we will give thanks for what is proclaimed to us in the Scripture. We most likely do this for several reasons. But underneath it all, I take it that what we do here is in some way explained a as a response on our part to our being known by Him who identifies Himself as the Good Shepherd. The shepherd has become the lamb. And so, we grapple with yet another facet of our Easter faith. It is proclaimed to us and repeated among us in a variety of ways: the sower has become a seed Himself, the grain of wheat that dies in our earth; the one who gives bread has Himself become bread broken and shared.

What we are about here is the celebration of someone who **knows** us, because He became who we are. It is not we who stand central here, with the knowledge of ourselves, of our sin and brokenness; that is to no avail; in fact, in some instances, it could be rather depressing. What stands central here is what God has done to us in Jesus. We know ourselves best by His wounds, by His suffering, by His death and His life. Here we are not washed clean by self-knowledge and self-accusation, but because He knows us in His very body and He carried us with Him as a mark on His risen body, as members of His risen body.

Our being known by this kind of shepherd issues forth in the mission to bring about concretely something of the vision of the book of Revelation. The Shepherd is still calling you forward, and it's never healthy to presume you've arrived at the pasture to end all pastures and have nowhere else to go. Some are being called farther than they may have dreamed or dared to go in the past. The vocation to leadership in the community of faith may be stirring in the hearts of a number who are present in this parish today. Paul and Barnabas took the message as far as they could. Now it's your turn to supply them with successors to share their joy.
