From the desk of Father William

The term ascension is susceptible to unintended comic imagery of Jesus waving good-bye from a balloon gondola or being lifted on a wire. Another unfortunate connotation is that heaven is somehow "up," while we are left down here. Perhaps such imagery does help us to imagine that in the resurrected Lord, God (heaven) and we (on earth) are united. Having become incarnate in Jesus, God is never only watching from some great distance. "I am with you until the end" are the simplest words, but the most profound. There is no need to stand

looking at the sky with our jaws hanging open. For Christ is here, as close as our own breath, keeping us alive to carry his presence into our world.

That is what the story of Jesus ascending into heaven is really all about. We do not have to look into the sky nor do we have to go to distant places to see Jesus. If we look around and are attentive, then we will discover enough traces of Jesus; if we care for our brothers and sisters, then we will taste something of heaven; we will stumble upon God. Heaven is not far away for those who look for it closely. We can shape our lives in such a way that we keep the door to heaven open. **Heaven and earth can be lived at the same time.** That is in the final analysis the significance of Jesus Ascension into heaven. It would indeed be a serious mistake if we thought of Jesus ascending into heaven as leaving our world and exchanging this world for a supposedly safer and holier place: heaven. That is what the story of Jesus ascending into heaven wants to convey. And as a result, for us as disciples of Jesus, what it takes is standing with both our feet on the ground without running from our everyday reality. The ground on which we stand, the place where we live is holy ground. All that it takes is shaping our own life after that of Jesus.

When we say Jesus ascended into heaven, we are saying that it has happened to one of our own kind. In Jesus our own vocation and dignity have been accomplished. I REPEAT Jesus has not turned his back on us or departed from our world. Jesus has not left our world in search of a better world beyond the stars. No, he is powerfully present and active among us to accomplish the task for which he was sent: the bringing about of love peace, forgiveness, justice freedom, humanness.

That still remains his task, his mission, but it is a task and a mission he can only accomplish through us. That is the reason resurrection stories and ascension stories turn into mission stories. We as his disciples



are sent forth. Even if peace, love, justice, freedom, forgiveness of all seem humanly unattainable they are within our reach when we let ourselves be guided by the Spirit of the Risen Jesus. So we pray: Risen and Ascended Jesus, send forth your spirit and renew the face of the earth so that we may become transformed men and women. On another note, Happy Mothers Day to all mothers on earth and in the realm of God!

Eligibility requirements:

Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.

Strong academic marks with experience in community involvement and volunteer work.

Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.

A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.

Since Easter and beyond to the Ascension and Pentecost, our Mass Readings include those taken from the ACTS (of the Apostles). Our parish library further details those very early days of the Apostles and the early church community life.

- -The Didache: A reconstruction of the faith, practices and rituals of the earliest Christian communities (50 to 70 AD) --- short with commentary
- -The Beginnings of the Church by F. Cwieckowski: The death of the Apostles, admission of the gentiles and separation of Christianity and Judaism; the spread of Christianity in the eastern Mediterranean.
- -<u>In the Steps of St Paul</u> by H V Morton. This remarkable travelogue of the author in 1935-36 (well before statehood of Israel recognized) tracing St Paul's journeys through Palestine, Israel, Syria, Turkey, Greece and Rome.
