Twinning with St. Patrick's Parish

SUNDAY - May 14th, 2023 Sixth Sunday of Easter

Today's Gospel picks up where last Sunday left off. John shows Jesus to be at his "tender-best." Jesus deals with the indwelling of the Father, Son, and Advocate in the life of the Christian. As the Church nears the Great Feast of Pentecost, Jesus reminds us that the Spirit of truth is at work in the world, in the church and in us. That is important for us to remember. For the disciples, as for us, being a follower can get difficult. Just like the early disciples who lived and proclaimed Jesus Christ during tough times, each of us will maneuver in our own way to proclaim the liberating power of the Gospel. For some of us, it may take a little longer; others may be stifled and afraid. However, each of us is called to build Christian community in unity and in love.

Today when St. Peter gives all of us evangelists our marching orders, "Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting of the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence." This sense of trust is what Peter holds up to the believers in the infant church. What faith! We Catholics tend to be leery of words like "testimony" and "witness" when it comes to the business of sharing our faith with others. We may prefer to keep our profession of faith in a more formal key: say, with a group recitation of the Apostles' or Nicene Creed. Many of us may feel ill-equipped to give a defense of the faith in the debate style known as apologetics. Yet each of us should be prepared to give the reason for our hope to anyone who asks. What keeps us faithful? And how does what we believe influence who we are becoming?

Christians are a hopeful people—an Easter people, if you will. In encouraging young people to hold on to hope, Pope Francis advises: "Dream of a world still not seen but will certainly come one day. Think of those who sailed oceans, scaled mountains, conquered slavery, or made life better for people on earth." Hope allows us to trust in Christ's promises that his Holy Spirit lives within us, that our lives have purpose, and that we can make a difference. Start small. As Saint Augustine advises: "You aspire to great things? Begin with little ones."

"The gift and presence of the Holy Spirit is the most magnificent and wonderful thing that can happen to us, the human community, all living things, and this earth," wrote German theologian Jürgen Moltmann. The disciples did not see it that way at first. They were filled with grief when Jesus told them he would soon be departing from them. They did not understand the gift they were about to receive in the Holy Spirit, the Advocate that Jesus promised to send upon his departure. An advocate "pleads the cause of another," "supports or promotes the interests of another." When the going gets tough, it is nice to know we have one at our side. We have

Jesus to thank for the Advocate—let us do so today. The Swiss theologian Hans Küng wrote that "I relied on and believed in the Spirit of Jesus Christ, who is alive today ... and to know that in everything, in all happiness and unhappiness, we are sustained by God." Fear not

Summer Faith Study: Seven Deadly Sins, Seven Lively Virtues

St. Andrew's Cathedral is pleased to offer another *Summer Faith Study* this year. The course is Bishop Robert Barron's study on sin and virtue. Over 8 weeks, the course will look at what the Catholic tradition calls the Seven Deadly Sins and contrasting them with what Bishop Barron refers to as the Seven Lively Virtues. The study is designed to increase understanding, promote reflection, and encourage practical action in people's lives to strengthen our wills against the many temptations to sin. Together we will explore how to combat pride with humility, turn envy into admiration, anger into forgiveness, sloth into zeal, avarice into generosity, gluttony into asceticism, and combat lust with chastity.
