The way Jesus shaped his life in obedience to God and in service to others made of his life an open door to heaven. That is what the story of Jesus ascending into heaven wants to convey. And as a result, for us as disciples of Jesus, what it takes is standing with both our feet on the ground without running from our everyday reality. Allow me to explain!

We have been baptized in Jesus' name and we have been filled with the spirit of Jesus. The risen Jesus has not disappeared from our world; he is present in our world in us, his branches, his Body. The risen and ascended Jesus has not become an extra- terrestrial being. He is for all times and all places the point of intersection between heaven and earth. Empowered by his spirit, it is now our turn to show that heaven and earth can still meet in the way we let our lives be shaped by what shaped the life of Jesus. And that is the kingdom- values of obedience to God and care for each other and for our world.

When we say Jesus ascended into heaven, we are saying that it has happened to one of our own kind. In Jesus, our own vocation and dignity have been accomplished. Jesus has not left our world in search of a better world beyond the stars. No, he is powerfully present and active among us to accomplish the task for which he was sent: the bringing about of love peace, forgiveness, justice freedom, humanness. It has everything to do with the piecemeal realization of heaven in a world which is still for too many people a hell; it is the gradual realization of God's kingdom on earth.

In today's gospel, Jesus is quite definite about his final will for his followers. They were to actively spread and share the saving message he had taught. This mission was simple to understand but difficult to carry out. It was to teach to others all that he had taught them. Just as his disciples had followed him, they would ask others to accept and follow him too. The work of conversion and salvation must go on from generation to generation, until the end of time. That remains his task, his mission, but is a task and a mission he can only accomplish through us. That is the reason resurrection stories and ascension stories turn into mission stories. We as his disciples are sent forth. Even if peace, love, justice, freedom, forgiveness of all seems humanly unattainable they are within our reach when we let ourselves be guided by the Spirit of the Risen Jesus. So, we pray: Risen and Ascended Jesus, send forth your spirit and renew the face of the earth so that we may become transformed men and women!

In closing, the Ascension of Jesus is about the power of change and the possibility of transformation, about a God who was willing to reach out to humanity and bring us into divinity. We can participate in that process by reaching out ourselves and helping to change the life of our neighbor. 17 years ago, on this feast day I was ordained a deacon in Port Alberni! Time flies but no greater joy!
