SUNDAY May 17, 2020 Sixth Sunday of Easter

Today's Gospel picks up where last Sunday left off. John shows Jesus to be at his "tender-best." Jesus deals with the indwelling of the Father, Son, and Advocate in the life of the Christian. Jesus described this "advocate" in another place as a "Paraclete." Paraclete derives from a Greek term meaning "called to the side of another" or "advocate." An advocate is someone who speaks for us, represents our interests, someone who stands by us and is concerned about our wellbeing. How comforting today's readings when Jesus explains that the Holy Spirit is an advocate, sent to be with us after Jesus no longer is. Alisa Wagner writes that: The Holy Spirit is like the wind. It can be gentle enough to stroke a leaf but hard enough to bend a tree.

My dear friends as the Church nears the Great Feast of Pentecost, Jesus reminds us that the Spirit of truth is at work in the world, in the church and in us. That is important for us to remember. For the disciples, as for us, being a follower can get difficult. Just like the early disciples who lived and proclaimed Jesus Christ during difficult times, each of us will maneuver in our own way to proclaim the liberating power of the Gospel. For some of us, it may take a little longer; others may be stifled and afraid. However, each of us is called to build Christian community in unity and in love. In our own way we proclaim the risen Lord. We all, however, are proclaiming the same Lord.

The Swiss theologian Hans Küng wrote that "I relied on and believed in the Spirit of Jesus Christ, who is alive today ... and to know that in everything, in all happiness and unhappiness, we are sustained by God." That we trust the power of the risen Lord at work in the world, in the Church, and in us and that in all things come what may, we are sustained by a good and gracious God who promises us he will not leave us. In these difficult days of living with Coved 19 and how it has changed us and our world, the reminder of a gracious God sustaining us is a much-needed grace.

Today when St. Peter gives all of us evangelists our marching orders, "Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence." This sense of trust is what Peter holds up to the believers in the infant church. What a faith! "The gift and presence of the Holy Spirit is the most magnificent and wonderful thing that can happen to us, the human community, all living things, and this earth," wrote German theologian Jürgen Moltmann. The disciples did not see it that way at first. They were filled with grief when Jesus told them he would soon be departing from them. They did not understand the gift they were about to receive in the Holy Spirit, the Advocate that Jesus promised to send upon his departure.

Dear friends, hope sustains! In these trying times, we may be tempted to dismiss hope as something akin to wishful thinking. Yet hope is a theological virtue, along with faith and love. These three put us into position for personal union with God. Hope orients us perpetually in a Godward direction no matter where life takes us. As Cistercian monk Aelred of Rivaulx declared: "What is hope but food for the journey to support us in the miseries of this life?" Cultivate hope by weeding out habits of negativity and cynicism.
