# **SUNDAY - May 1st, 2022** Third Sunday of Easter

God has given me the gift of teaching. When I received my Education Degree, I entered the school system with enthusiasm, passion, and a desire to journey together with my students to learn, discover, and grow. After numerous years of teaching, I had an opportunity to further my education with a Master of Divinity and I worked as a Pastoral Associate. Moving back to Saskatoon, I was in between jobs, so I started subbing in the Catholic system thinking I would go back to teaching. My heart wasn't fully committed but it's something I knew, teaching was familiar. It was then that the Lay Formation Coordinator position was posted with the Diocese of Saskatoon, an opportunity to journey with adults that wanted to deepen their relationship with God through prayer, community, and learning. It was God saying, Mona, cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find.... God calling me 'to be' in the world using the gift of teaching in a different way. I responded to that call and continue to this day.

God has freely given each of us gifts and calls us to use those gifts to build up the kingdom here on earth. Like the disciples in John's gospel, each received gifts to build the church Jesus revealed, yet the past two weeks have thrown them into a whirlwind of despair and desolation. Gathering together on the shore, the smell of the sea, the sight of their fishing boats, and the feel of the nets bring a familiarization, a sense of comfort, albeit an empty comfort, as they return to what they know. All night long they fish yet catch nothing. This dark night of the soul where confusion, bewilderment, and emptiness pursues them is transformed in the early morning light when Divine guidance intervenes and blesses them with an invitation to cast the net to the right side of the boat. They obey and their net encompasses an abundance. Jesus calls these seasoned fishers to use their gifts to fish for people, to bring about God's kingdom in a new way.

Jesus never gives up on us. He is always inviting us into a deeper relationship. No matter what we do, Jesus calls us forth, so it's important here to ask, what nets are we caught up in that prevent us from letting God love us? Are we, like Peter, tangled up in the net of self-loathing because of our denial of Jesus? What about the net of not believing that we are worthy or deserving of God's love? Then there's the net of not trusting and having faith in God's Word. So what does Jesus do when we are trapped in this web of lies? He asks us if we love Him; he asks us to focus on that love; he asks us to feed His lambs. Many times during the day Jesus asks us, *do you love me*, and He waits for our response; He waits for us to choose; He waits for our humble, contrite hearts.

Jesus wants us to know our sins and to become aware of how they rupture our relationship with Him. Once we acknowledge them, we can put our full attention on His mercy and love and how He tends to our wounds by healing the void and restoring us into right relationship. Jesus loves us to death and into eternal life! His love knows no bounds for us, fulfills our deepest longings, and calls forth a commitment to put on Christ each and every day. Jesus is asking us to get off the fence and "Follow me!"

### EASTER LETTER FROM ST. VINCENT DE PAUL, HOLY CROSS CHAPTER

Easter is a time for us to reflect and share Christ's teachings. He has brought us together as a family with His love, compassion and forgiveness. The Parishioner's thoughtfulness has enabled our Society to continue supporting marginalized people and their families. Help is given to an inner city school's breakfast and lunch programme. You gave assistance to a single parent, whose child had health issues and required therapy. At Rosalie's Village, another single Mother is taking courses to improve her education, which will enable her to become available for employment. A monthly donation is presented to the Society's food bank, where there is an ongoing need for support for low income families and the homeless. You've continued to maintain missions in Colombia and Zambia. In Colombia, a daycare centre provides free school training for 97 students from very impoverished families. The Zambian donation has paid for the nurse's and teacher's programmes. One of the registered nurses would like to come to Canada. Nex year, Mutinta, a young blind girl will graduate with a teacher's certificate. All the young people are very grateful for these opportunities and without your gifts, they wouldn't be able to fulfill their dreams. We would like to thank you for the continuing prayers and sharing your generosity, which has given hope, joy, encouragement and enriched those who are less fortunate than ourselves.

Registration is now open for a Roots of Reconciliation - Indigenous Session Workshop, to be held June 7-10, 202 at Holy Cross Parish Hall in Victoria.

Roots of Reconciliation is a four day workshop facilitated by the team from Returning to Spirit<sup>©</sup>, an Indigenous-led non-profit organization which has been delivering experiential reconciliation workshops since 2001. The insights developed during the workshop create space for participants to discover how previously-held behaviours, judgements, assumptions or perceptions have kept them stuck in a disempowering story.

This workshop in Victoria, BC is open to those who are over 18 and identify as Indigenous. The material at the workshop will be same as that covered at the non-Indigenous session being held May 16-19. By having separate sessions, the facilitators and participants can better focus on the different lived realities of each group. All Roots of Reconciliation workshop participants will be invited to register in the Advancing Reconciliation workshop scheduled for lune 27 - 30, 2022.

Each day of the workshop will run from 9:00 am - 4:30 pm. Registration is by donation; please note that accommodation and transportation for participants are not included in registration. The Blessed Marie Anne Blondin Bursary (\$1000): for a lay woman who is accepted or enrolled in a program or course for ministry in the Church, such as religious education, social justice, liturgy, social action, care of the sick, etc.

<u>The Char Deslippe Memorial Award</u> (\$500): for a teacher working in Island Catholic Schools or a parish catechist serving in children, youth or adult ministry.
