From the desk of Father William

Paul talks about the driving force of that whole first generation of believers who claimed Jesus as Lord. Their experience was so powerful, it transcended everything else about their lives. It didn't matter anymore if they were Jews or Gentiles (and this used to be the most significant matter of all). Remember the beginning? Later on that day, the disciples had gathered together, but, fearful of the Jews, had locked all the doors in the house. Jesus entered, stood among them, and said, "Peace to you." Then he showed them his hands and side. The disciples, seeing the

Master with their own eyes, were exuberant. Jesus repeated his greeting: "Peace to you. Just as the Father sent me, I send you." Then he took a deep breath and breathed into them. "Receive the Holy Spirit," he said. "If you forgive someone's sins, they're gone for good. If you don't forgive sins, what are you going to do with them?"

How can we recapture the spirit of that early church? We can begin by rereading the giving of the Holy Spirit stories? We hear different "giving of the Spirit" stories today: the spectacular events in the "upper room" and the risen Jesus' breathing the Spirit on the disciples when he first appeared to them. However we tell the story, the presence of the Spirit is essential to the mission of Christ's disciples. As sharers in their heritage and as present-day disciples, consider these questions: Through the Holy Spirit comes forgiveness of sins. Where have you most deeply felt the power of forgiveness? When have you especially felt the presence of the Holy Spirit? How has the Spirit worked in your life? How do you witness to your faith? What are the particular gifts, forms of service, abilities, and work you offer to the church? How do your gifts contribute to the building up of the church? How can we encourage others to use their gifts to do the same?

We need the gift of peace to help us put an end to war, violence, terrorism and our own anger and fears. We need God's help so that we can forgive the sins that keep us from moving on to new and better things for our family and for our society. We need the courage to drop our fears and speak up for what is right for all God's children. We have to go out of our personal "upper rooms" and allow God's Spirit to lead us and forever make home in us. The risen Jesus unleashes his Spirit upon us. Do we really believe that from now on, Jesus raised from the dead is at work among us in the power of the Spirit? "So I send you... Receive the Holy Spirit." Today dear friends, we celebrate a mystery that happened and continues to happen to us, as disciples of Jesus.

The Spirit we celebrate at Pentecost is more than just a pragmatic attitude. It is the fulfillment of all that God promised to us 50 days ago on Easter. For these past weeks we have been preparing ourselves to live the kind of lives that will make God's loving presence known and felt to all with whom we come into contact. The Spirit is given to us if we share the Spirit's love with others. Great things do happen. Peter, remember, had denied Jesus, but now speaks so eloquently that all who hear him have the fire burn in their hearts.

Eligibility requirements:

Individual facing family difficulties / financial hardship.

Strong academic marks with experience in community involvement and volunteer work.

Full time student at Post Secondary institution/ college or trade school.

A practicing catholic involved in their parish community.

Scholarship: \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.

Essay: Write a one page essay (maximum 200 to 250 words) stating your career objectives, your accomplishments, your community and volunteer involvement. Tell us why you need financial assistance.

Since Easter and beyond to the Ascension and Pentecost, our Mass Readings include those taken from the ACTS (of the Apostles). Our parish library further details those very early days of the Apostles and the early church community life.

- -The Didache: A reconstruction of the faith, practices and rituals of the earliest Christian communities (50 to 70 AD) --- short with commentary
- -The Beginnings of the Church by F. Cwieckowski: The death of the Apostles, admission of the gentiles and separation of Christianity and Judaism; the spread of Christianity in the eastern Mediterranean.
- -<u>In the Steps of St Paul</u> by H V Morton. This remarkable travelogue of the author in 1935-36 (well before statehood of Israel recognized) tracing St Paul's journeys through Palestine, Israel, Syria, Turkey, Greece and Rome.
