From the desk of Father William

Meanwhile, the II disciples were on their way to Galilee, headed for the mountain Jesus had set for their reunion. The moment they saw him they worshiped him. Some, though, held back, not sure about worship, about risking themselves totally. Jesus, undeterred, went right ahead and gave his charge: "God authorized and commanded me to commission you: Go out and train everyone you meet, far and near, in this way of life, marking them by Baptism in the threefold name: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Then instruct them in the practice of all I have commanded you. I'll be with you as you do this, day after day after day, right up to the end of the age"

On this day, we celebrate not only the existence of God, but the relationship that God chooses to have with us. The Trinity is not just a diagram of God's Person (or Persons). It's not a blueprint for how God operates, either. The Trinity is our way of expressing the relationship God has with us. God creates, redeems, and sanctifies us. God brought us and everything into being out of love, rescues us from our worst moves and their ultimate consequences, and "makes us holy"—that is, gives us the grace we need to become more like ourselves, the people we were made to be, in the image of the Holy One. Sin disfigures us. Grace restores us. God is love, as Saint John says, and love constantly calls the beloved to come home and celebrate.

The Christian ethicist Stanley Hauerwas has said, "Christianity is not beliefs about God plus behavior. We are Christians not because of what we believe, but because we have been called to be disciples of Jesus. To become a disciple is not a matter of a new or changed self-understanding, but rather to become part of a different community with a different set of practices." In other words, being the disciples Jesus commands his church is as much about doing as being. Today's readings seem to say we need to do both: Be adopted children of God, and do what God commands. How do you understand the Trinity in ways that avoid too much abstraction? What are some concrete ways you have lived out a Trinitarian faith? What do Saint Paul's words about suffering with Christ in order to be glorified with Christ mean to me? How are you an "heir" of God? What in your "inheritance" of faith do I value the most? Do not let fear of inadequacy or the unknown stop you from listening to the Lord's call. Go therefore and teach what you have learned.

We may never fully understand One God, Three Persons, and Distinct yet united. But when we gather as a community of faith to celebrate and worship, we are living in its reality and for good or ill we are the hands and feet of Christ today. One of the things that Jesus wanted most is that we live right with each other. So we pray: Risen and Ascended Jesus send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth so that we can become transformed men and women. Let us hold on to each other and let us encourage and support each other in the faith conviction we celebrate here this day, so that none of us will lose sight of the light that Jesus is.

Since Easter and beyond to the Ascension and Pentecost, our Mass Readings include those taken from the ACTS (of the Apostles). Our parish library further details those very early days of the Apostles and the early church community life.

- -The Didache: A reconstruction of the faith, practices and rituals of the earliest Christian communities (50 to 70 AD) --- short with commentary
- -The Beginnings of the Church by F. Cwieckowski: The death of the Apostles, admission of the gentiles and separation of Christianity and Judaism; the spread of Christianity in the eastern Mediterranean.
- -In the Steps of St Paul by H V Morton. This remarkable travelogue of the author in 1935 -36 (well before statehood of Israel recognized) tracing St Paul's journeys through Palestine, Israel, Syria, Turkey, Greece and Rome.
