SUNDAY - May 29th, 2022 The Ascension of the Lord

Today, when we celebrate the Ascension of Christ, we are not celebrating something in addition to his resurrection. Rather, it is an aspect of the resurrection message. It is still very much Easter. When we hear that Jesus ascended into heaven and that he is seated at the right hand of the Father, then we may wonder: "What is there in that statement for us?" Much depends on how we understand it. If we take a closer look at what our Christian tradition tries to express in the image of Jesus ascending into heaven, then there may be more in it for us than at first we may be inclined to think.

Luke is the only evangelist who tells Ascension stories, two of them, in his gospel and in Acts. The synoptic gospel writers seem uninvested in the question of what happens to Jesus after the Resurrection; specifically, where did he go from here? Removing his glorified body from the scene is almost a housekeeping detail in the story, but Luke readily takes it on, because in a much larger sense we know precisely where Jesus can be found next: in his Body, the church. Again, Luke is the only evangelist who assumes responsibility for the telling of this story as well, which is why we have the Acts of the Apostles.

It's ironic that Luke supplies us with two graphic Ascension stories only to counter our fascination with them in the angels' scolding: "Why are you standing there looking at the sky?" The precise posture of Jesus in heaven is never the point of the story, any more than is enlightenment on the score of whether anyone sits or stands in eternity. Our attention, we're given to understand, should be fixed on this world where hourly responsibilities lie. It's here that we're to carry our witness of "these things," as Luke calls them: the death and Resurrection of Jesus, the necessity of repentance, and the forgiveness of sins. The Body of Christ is still here, carrying on the divine mission until the end of time. A blare of trumpets is entirely appropriate.

Concretely, that means that we place ourselves in his Spirit on the side of the vulnerable and marginalized in our society, and that we promote human life everywhere. Whatever makes life more human becomes our task. In short, from our witness in word, but above all in deeds it must become evident that Jesus has not been eliminated from our world but is in fact very much active in it. From now on, it is by means of our lives, by means of our discipleship that we give concrete evidence of the fact that Jesus is not absent from our world, but still very much present in our world. In other words, how do we respond now to today's gospel in which Jesus assures us that we will never be alone?

"Remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age," Jesus has promised. Blessed are we who believe that the promises made by our Lord and Savior will be fulfilled!

Scholarship: \$2000 per year. Scholarship will be renewed for up to three additional years based on financial hardship and need.
