SUNDAY - May 2, 2021 Fifth Sunday of Easter

Aren't we blessed that we get 7 weeks to really enter into the graces Easter offers? It is such a privileged time and place to reflect and engage with the Scripture stories. Over these past few weeks we have seen the Lord; we have heard about mission; we are called to be witnesses; we live into our relationship with the Good Shepherd; we abide in Jesus' indwelling presence.

We have met our Easter cast of characters and the various places Jesus has appeared to them: Mary, Peter, John, Thomas, and the other disciples at the tomb, in the garden, on the road to Emmaus, in the upper room, at the seashore. Each character tells a part of the Easter story: Mary's vigil, tears, recognition, and witness; Peter's fear and denial, and Jesus' forgiveness and commission to feed and defend His flock; John's belief at the empty tomb; Thomas' questioning, asking, touching, and statement of faith. Their actions reveal how Christ encounters us where we are as He journeys with us. God calls all of us to enter into the Easter story. What is our part in this great adventure?

We hear Jesus' words 'Peace be with you' numerus times as He appears to the disciples. Jesus is our consoler. We learn about the Good Shepherd, the One who lays down His life out of love for us - the one flock. His voice brings comfort, hope, safety and security. Today, we are called to abide in the one true vine, the constant guiding presence that abides with us always.

What does it mean to abide in Christ? It is a mutual dynamic relationship where we pitch our tents and rest in God's Word, plan, promise, kingdom, love and peace. It is an intimate, fruitful union, steadfast and everlasting - the final covenant. It is a desire for Jesus, a sense of dwelling and enduring with Jesus, and incorporating Him into our daily lives.

Jesus emphasized a *mutual* relationship. Abiding is something we must *choose*. It is impossible for the branch to bear grapes if it isn't connected to the vine. Only Jesus can produce fruit in our lives. We are invited to abide, to allow the Word of God to dwell in us, trusting in the abiding presence of the Holy Spirit to transform us.

Christ is the true vine who bears fruit by giving His life freely, shedding His blood, and becoming the blessing cup, the new wine of salvation. We are called to surrender freely, like St. Ignatius suggests in his Suscipe prayer: "Take Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will". Total surrender and self-giving allows the indwelling presence to spring forth in and through our God given gifts as we share them with the world. Like the Good Shepherd, the Vinedresser lovingly tends to the branches, lifts us up, prunes and burns away dis-ease so we can bear fruit abundantly.

How have we seen the risen Lord these past few weeks in our everyday lives? Have we connected with others, shared stories of how God continues to touch us? Have we given thanks to God for the miracles of spring, the warmth of the sun? Take this graced time to abide in Jesus, listen to His voice, and trim the wick of the Easter candle within to burn even brighter. God is calling. Ask and receive!

Dear fellow parishioners of Holy Cross and St. Patrick's:

Holy Cross Parish and St. Patrick's are both members of Greater Victoria Acting Together (GVAT), a coalition of civil society organizations composed of faith groups, trade unions, non-profits and post-secondary students advocating for the greater good. One of our research groups is focused on Mental Health, with a particular interest in the well-being of children and youth. A sub-group, of which I am part, is focusing on the proposed school board budget cuts for the 2021/22 school year.

School District 61 (Greater Victoria) is proposing cuts to programs such as Grades 5 to 8 Music, Reading Recovery, Educational Assistants and Family and Youth Counsellors. Such services are particularly critical given the impact of the pandemic on students' anxiety and mental health.

We are aware that the adverse impact of the COVID pandemic on school districts has caused a serious budget crisis. School districts are legally proscribed from running deficits, and rely on the Province to respond appropriately with funding in situations like the pandemic. Emergency funding was provided for the current year.

We are urging the Province to allocate contingency funds to districts to stop cuts, so that schools can continue to be safe and inspiring places for students, when they return in the new school year.

I have provided a template of a sample letter, and am urging concerned parishioners of Holy Cross and St. Patrick's to write to the Minister of Education and the Minister of Finance, with copies to your MLA. and opposition members prior to May 10th. Email addresses attached.

Please feel free to personalize your letters with stories of how you, a family member, or a friend have been helped by these programs.

Dear Ministers Whiteside and Robinson:

Re: Additional Funding to School Districts to Prevent Cutting Vital Programs

The lack of additional funding for education in the recently announced budget is a disappointment. Districts across the province are facing unprecedented costs coming out of the pandemic academic year of 2020/2021, coupled with halted revenue streams. As school districts are legally mandated to have a balanced budget, they are looking to cut vital programs that will irrevocably harm school cultures and the mental health of students and teachers.

In the budget, more than 3 billion dollars have been put aside as contingency funds. I urge the government to allocate a small slice of this to the school districts to stop cuts. Mental health is a priority for your government, and I cannot think of a better way to ensure the mental health of students and teachers across this province during the pandemic than having programs remain as they are, and for schools to continue being a safe and inspiring place for all students.
