SUNDAY May 5, 2019 Third Sunday of Easter

Jesus appears to the apostles for the third time since he was raised from the dead. Every apparition of Jesus during the forty days before the Ascension has a specific purpose. Today we learn about our Lord's encounter with Simon Peter. Perhaps we can see a little of our journey in faith paralleling the times of doubt and frustration that Peter seems to exhibit. We know that Jesus has chosen Peter for this discipleship, but previously, Peter had been so afraid that he denied being Christ's disciple three times. Jesus now lovingly pursues Simon Peter, Son of John.

We are told that seven of the disciples had gone to Galilee after leaving Jerusalem and found themselves in one of their familiar lakesides. Simon Peter, as usual is their leader. All have been waiting to see what post resurrection life will mean for them. Apparently Peter is impatient and returns to fishing. His friends readily go with him as most of the disciples were fishermen. They fish all night and catch nothing. Perhaps it was still dark as Jesus called out to them. They had not recognized Jesus, but with the instructions on where to throw the nets, John soon told Peter it was Jesus. Imagine the thrill of Peter swimming to greet Jesus.

On the shore the disciples were uneasy in the presences of the risen Lord. He put them at ease, inviting them to come and share a breakfast of fish and bread. After partaking of the breakfast, Jesus probably took Peter for a walk. I can imagine them talking in private as we know Jesus asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" Peter was hurt that he was asked three times. He probably remembered how on three successive occasions during that 'terrible night' he had denied all knowledge of Jesus. Peter answers with, "You know I love you." Thus he reaffirms his faith and his love for Jesus. Jesus also gives him a commission. Peter, despite all his flaws, is to be the pastor of Jesus' flock. His image has changed from a fisher of men to shepherding.

Jesus' resurrection changed everything. Peter and the disciples experienced three years of preparation and now lived in uncertainty. Jesus was gone. We too have experienced times of radical change. As with Peter transitional times have questions of what, where, when and how, that put us in the unknown, the unfamiliar. This gospel echoes Jesus' words, "Follow me" and "Do not be afraid". Peter had the joy of seeing and being with the risen Christ. With the eyes of our soul, have we seen how Jesus looks at us with

love? As with Peter, our Lord shows that a person's past doesn't pose obstacles to Him. He is more focused on the work he has for us to do. It is with wonder that we can release our fears and find it easier to trust. Deep in our hearts and souls, we know Jesus is holding...treasuring...loving each and every one of us.

Jesus looks at you with Love.

Since Easter and beyond to the Ascension and Pentecost, our Mass Readings include those taken from the ACTS (of the Apostles). Our parish library details those very early days of the Apostles and the early church community life. The Apostles were endowed and continued with Christ's gift of healing.
