

to a different way of being in the world, a different way of seeing things, and a different way of understanding how God works. We are called to be of service, to be in relationship, to live as one by relying on God and letting the power of Love propel us forth.

The new Christian community in Acts struggled with growing pains. And why wouldn't they? They were all human beings coming together from various cultures and languages because of their belief in the One, the Messiah, Jesus the Christ. When different groups gather together, our biases, beliefs, and differences rise to the forefront; our ideas of right and wrong, justice, societal structure, pride blind us to the depth of service, surrender, and Love that flowed from the cross ensuring the gift of the Spirit for all.

A conflict between the Hellenists (Greek speaking Jews) and the Hebrews (Aramaic speaking Jews) with regards to their widows not receiving their fair portion of food came to a head. The Hellenists, a minority, were mostly from the Diaspora, Jews that were scattered over the Roman Empire and became immersed in the Greek culture. The Hebrews embraced the Jewish culture and were more the local majority. We just have to look at the world today and see how things play out when a displaced minority tries to blend with the majority even though both groups seek the same basic needs such as food, shelter, and safety. Communities face struggles, barriers, fears, and collaboration and common good usually gets pushed aside.

The first reading gives us specific steps for conflict resolution that we can employ within our own families, communities, and countries:

- 1. The Hellenists **bring their needs forward**. How often do we just keep complaining and blaming without naming and moving forward together?
- 2. The Hebrews **see** the legitimacy of the situation and **trusted** the apostles to correct it. Are we able to see the other side of the story and stand corrected or do we circle in and protect what's ours?
- 3. The apostles **responded** by bringing the issue to the whole community, **asking** for solutions, and **sharing** the various services that are essential to deepening the common good. Can we let go of control and be open to ideas other than our own?
- 4. The seven chosen men **accepted the call** to distribute the food for the community; they were from the Hellenist group. Do we heed God's call, share our God-given gifts, and let others take leadership?

All gifts are essential in building a compassionate, just, and peaceful community. We cannot do it on our own. Christ is our cornerstone. He calms our anxieties and fears and assures us of eternal life; He leads us on the right path and becomes our pathway; He is the truth that sets us free and gifts us with the Spirit of truth; He is the true life as He gives His life for all; He reveals the heart of God and wants us to trust and believe that God dwells within.

"Without the way there is no going; without the truth there is no knowing; without the life there is no living. I am the way which thou must follow; the truth in which thou must believe; the life for which thou must hope." (a' Kempis)

All are welcome, all are invited to participate, and all are asked to share their gifts to be God's message in the world. We are *a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people* called to be *living stones* where we will be rejected, sacrificed, and used for the greater glory of God. Believe, and let LOVE welcome us home!
