Mother's Day

We see the two sides of Christian living in the reading's this week! The Gospel radiates a calmness and peace and reassurance that we all so oftentimes need, and the first reading reflects on the area of difference and conflict that is bound to rise when Christians come face to face with new problems and new questions for the articulation of our faith. And come they do...then and now! The book of Acts shows us that the early Church was just like us today ... human. The followers were divided. Jesus was no longer among them as before. He had taught them, and the Spirit was sent to strengthen them, but conflicts arose as they always do. To seek unity, they gathered to pray, listen, and discern. Should Gentiles follow the same laws as Jews in the Christian movement? For the early Jewish disciples, it was difficult for them to give up the rules and the customs that governed every aspect of their worship. They believed that these ritual actions made them Holy in the sight of God.

That is why Peter walked into Cornelius' house with strongly cherished notions of who is and is not a member of the household of God. Circumcised believers who keep kosher were in; Gentiles with their unclean ways were obviously out. Nonetheless, the Holy Spirit did not respect his crystal distinction, pouring divine gifts lavishly on these unacceptable outsiders. Either Peter got it wrong, or God did. The smart money is on God. But Peter gets points for feeling his way through a very inclusive introduction—"I see that God shows no partiality"—followed by immediate responsiveness to the Spirit's downpour: "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people?" Peter kept talking to the Lord and so must we.

Dear friends, the beauty of Jesus farewell address is that it is his last will and testament, and we better listen! Jesus says to his disciples then and now to continue his legacy of love and peace. He assures them and us that the Holy Spirit will guide and teach them and us. They were distressed and Jesus speaks of peace by sending an advocate. This can be translated as Paraclete or comforter. It is much more than that... it is the one who speaks for you and stands up for you in time of need. The Jesuit Gerald Manley Hopkins wrote: The Paraclete is the one who cheers for us, who encourages us and persuades us to go forward. The Holy Spirit will help us through our troubles, gives us confidence to face the future and help us to take the risks we need to take and say the things we need to say.

Happy Mother's Day to our all mothers on earth and in heaven.
